#### **Slow Play**

Our drive to improve the pace of play continues, although slowly. As stated in a letter to the Tuesday players the Board will initiate a slow play penalty beginning with our game on April 5<sup>th</sup>. All Tuesday players should have seen the pace of play conditions set forth by the Board. If not, you can read them here <u>SlowPlay</u>.

#### **Choice of Tees**

The Board has evaluated the results of having players play from different tees on Tuesdays. Bottom line is that, while the sample is small, the difference is also small. Therefore, we have decided to continue the choice of tee options as follows.

We will play 'Choice of Tees' on the following weeks:

• **1st Tuesday** of every month (\$10 game + \$5 skins)

- **2nd Tuesday** of every month (\$10 game + \$5 skins)
- **5th Tuesday** of the month, when there is one. (\$10 game + \$5 skins)

Each player should indicate the tee they played by printing a 'B', 'C', or 'W' in one of the 2 columns to the far right hand side of the scorecard (HCP or NET column). Another option would be to identify your tees played (B, C, or W) right next to your name.

- 3rd Tuesday of the month will remain our monthly tournament and will be played as defined in our tournament schedule <u>found</u> <u>here</u>. The tournament tees will remain as combo unless otherwise noted. (\$15 game + \$5 skins)
- 4th Tuesday of the month will remain our newly formed 'Game of the Month' and will be defined by our Tournament Director (Roger Morey). He will document the game, and the associated entry fee, in his weekly email.

#### **SLOW PLAY**

Over the last few months Redhawk Golfers Club has been trying to address slow play in several different ways and we have made some improvement. However almost every week, there is still a group that is at 5 hours or more. This sets back every group behind them which leads to frustration and in some cases, it has caused players to leave the club.

As a result, the Board has decided to implement a more drastic measure to address slow play. Starting on April 5<sup>th</sup> a 1 stroke penalty will be assessed to each player in the group that finishes their round in more than 4 hours and 45 minutes **AND** finishes more than 15 minutes behind the group in front of them.

#### How this will work

- Each group will continue to have a staggered time to leave the cart area. This allows the "A" groups starting farther away to tee off at 8:00.
- Write the time that the first player in your group tees off on your score card.
- Immediately after completing your round, and before going to your car, drop off a completed scorecard from your group with the Board member collecting them at Hawks Landing. The Board member will mark the time on the card when it is handed to him.
- Anyone turning in a card after 12:45PM is in danger of the penalty stroke.
- After turning in your card, you can take your clubs to the parking lot and do whatever you need to do.

- When this is complete, a designee from your group needs to come into Hawk's Landing to read off your scores to the entry person.
- The Scoring team will compare the tee off time to the time turned in, to determine if it is greater than 4'45". For each score card that has a play time greater than 4'45", the team will compare it to the group playing in front of them. For each of these that is greater than 15 minutes behind the group in front of them, a 1 stroke penalty will be assessed to each player in that group.

Gentlemen, this has been a topic of conversation since before to our meeting last December. About half of the attendees at the meeting wanted us to implement a penalty at that time, and we decided not to. Now, after numerous unsuccessful attempts to speed up play, we feel it's necessary to implement a penalty program.

As a point of reference, we are much more lenient than the SCGA recommendations. They recommend a 4'15" round, a 14-minute gap, and a 2-stroke penalty. If our plan doesn't get positive results we will implement the SCGA plan. You can read it <u>here.</u>

We started this procedure on 3/15, are evaluating the results, will make any necessary adjustments, and will start assessing penalties on 4/5.
