Handicap Update, By Alan de la Sierra

Last time I measured my swing speed, I averaged 90 mph with a low of 86 to a high of 94 mph. For those of you challenged by a swing speed less than what you see with the youngster's all around us, or on the professional circuit, this article taken from the March 2022 issue of "Golf Magazine" may be of interest to you. It caught my attention.

On the Tee: Driver or 3-wood?

"I HIT MY 3-WOOD farther than my driver" is a common refrain heard on courses across the country. Is it true, and, if so, why? The answer depends on your swing speed.

To prove this, we armed the ClubTest robot with a 10.5-degree driver and a 15-degree 3-wood and ran swings at 60, 70, 80 and 90 mph with both clubs, tuning the robot to catch the ball in the center of the clubface.

Test results showed that at 60 mph, the 3-wood was four yards longer than the driver. At 70 mph, the 3-wood was five yards longer than the driver. At 80 mph, the driver and 3-wood hit the ball equal distances. Here's the rub: At 90 mph, the driver was 13 yards longer than the 3-wood. Although the 3-wood moved 2 mph slower than the driver,

its increased launch angle and spin rate aided distance at the slower speeds.

Fact: Slower swinging players benefit from more loft and spin, so if you max out at 85 mph, your 3-wood can be as long -- if not longer -- than your driver.

I know all of us like hitting the Driver but maybe the 3-Wood is a better alternative. I may have to try it out for myself. How about you?
