Our Old Testament reading for today is well known to us—likely one we have heard since childhood. Moses, who is tending his father-in-law's flock at the base of Mount Horeb, may be looking for distractions to while away the time when he sees a bush in flames just off the path. What is remarkable is not the burning bush itself but its staying power. The bush is not consumed. As many of us would, Moses decides to check it out.

Moses' openness becomes God's cue to call out to him, indeed, to

summon him far beyond what he believes himself capable. Notice that when God calls him by name, Moses responds simply, "Here I am." In Hebrew, this is just one word, *hinneni*. It is how Abraham responded to God at the ultimate test of his faith (Genesis 22) and how many prophets after him also will respond to their call. Once God alerts Moses to the holy ground and identifies himself in the covenantal tradition of Moses' ancestors, Moses lowers his face in fear but remains. Much staying power will be required of him as well in the coming years.

God then reveals his intentions to bring the Israelites out of oppression in Egypt into this very wilderness where they will worship God in freedom. Moses is God's chosen prophet and leader. This scene culminates when, at Moses' request, God further reveals the divine name, YHWH, a form of the verb "to be." God is the essence of being, the "I AM," a name so sacred that it should not be uttered. Our reverence is indicated in the address, "LORD."

- Moses is snatched out of his daily routine and called to be a leader and God's spokesperson, or "prophet." Are you open to God calling you in new ways?
- Reflect on God as the essence of being. Does this change your concept of God?
- How have you been challenged beyond your supposed capabilities in your life? Do you have the staying power to which God calls us? How might you build such endurance?

Practice of Faith

In this reading from Exodus, we can only imagine Moses as awestruck as a voice called to him from the burning bush. God called Moses by name, commanding him to remove his sandals, for that area was holy ground. Then we hear the Name of all names: the great I AM. How often do we allow ourselves the opportunity to be mystified by the presence of our Lord? Do we

stop at the end of each day to reflect on God's presence?

- In an extended prayer time, contemplate the moments when you felt God in your midst during the past several years and journal about them.
- When you next enter a Catholic church, think about why we genuflect when adoration is taking place or bow when the reserved Eucharist is not exposed. This prayerful action confirms our belief in God's presence in a holy place where our expressions of reverence are most appropriate.
- Consider how you honor God's presence during the day.

Questions

- What meaning do you take from God's name "I am who am," and what do you think it means when Moses tells the Israelites that "I am" sent me to you?
- In what ways are you trying to be like the description of God in today's responsorial psalm: merciful, slow to anger, and abiding in kindness? In what ways could you try to pardon others as the Lord pardons us?
- How do you prepare yourself to celebrate the sacrament of penance? Do you use an examination of conscience? Do you do a review at the end of each day? Do you rely on the promptings of the Spirit to tell you where you need forgiveness?

Activities

- March 25 is the Annunciation of the Lord. As part of your prayer this week, read Luke 1:26-38 and meditate on Mary's words, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word."
- Water is one of the principal symbols of the season of Lent. Give thanks for the baptismal water that was your own entrance into the life of Christ. This Lent consider how you might lead others to baptism. How can you make yourself available to seekers and invite them to your parish so that they will be led to these saving, refreshing, and life-giving waters?

forwarding your donations to help them.


Thursday, when I returned from the G-3 Continuing Anglican dialogue in Columbia, SC, I came back to a \$1 K check from the Manchester Rotary Club to assist our Ukraine Aid through the PKK The gift was encouraged by a RC Rotarian who wanted to support our effort. Then a phone call and discussion from a non-parishioner turned into an additional \$150.

Thursday night, the parish discussed Ukranian Aid. I read to them the draft of a PNCC/G-3 meeting press release, also in today's <u>GŁOS</u> and worth a read. I mentioned an e-mail from Brian Marsh the same day indicating the IAF had already cut a check for \$1 K to assist us in our effort.

Our parish committee then votes to give \$ 5,000 to the fundraising effort for the Ukraine through the PKK churches. They then voted to match all gifts received by the parish over the next three weeks up to an additional \$5,000.00. So, we are matching the Rotary Donation, the additional \$150, and two additional \$50 gifts. That's \$2,500 already in matching. So the donations here are at \$7,500 already, with at least a \$10 K potential.

Praise God, and blessings to all of our HTC parishioners! Wow!





Discipleship Is Not a Part-Time Job

Being a disciple of Christ is not a part-time job. It is not something we do distracted, with half our effort, simply to get it done. It's not simply about joining a church or accepting Jesus as our "Lord and Savior," nor is it enough to profess with our lips what we believe. Being his disciple means transforming every aspect of our lives so that nothing, not even the smallest part of who we are, is out of touch with the mission of Christ. It's about giving every ounce of our being to the God who created us, taking up whatever we are called to do, whenever we are called to do it, without hesitation. We cannot do that if we are busy holding onto something else, saving something to the side "in case this doesn't work out." God wants everything from us, and so we're either fully in, or we're not in at all. Let go of what holds you back, and live completely in the freedom of being a disciple of Christ.

Anglican G3 - PNCC Churches working together to provide humanitarian relief for Ukraine

On March 15 and 16, 2022, the G-3/PNCC Ecumenical Dialogue Group met at the Anglican Cathedral of the Epiphany in Columbia, South Carolina. Representing the G-3 were Archbishop Mark Haverland (Anglican Catholic Church - ACC), Archbishop Chandler Jones (Anglican Province in America - APA) Bishops Paul Hewett (Anglican Catholic Church - DHC), Brian Marsh (Anglican Church in America -ACA), and Alexander Webb (ACA) and Fathers Robert Bader (ACC -DHC), Jonathan Foggin (ACC), Creighton McElveen (APA) and Christian Tutor (ACA). Polish National Catholic Church members included Prime Bishop Anthony Mikovsky, Bishop Paul Sobiechowski, Father Seniors Robert Nemkovich Jr. and John Kowalczyk and Father Scott Lill. Bishops Hewett and Sobiechowski served as the Dialogue Co-Chairman for this meeting.

With prayer and concern for the war in Ukraine the Anglican G3 and PNCC Churches decided to work together to aid those fleeing from Ukraine. Contributions from the churches and The International Anglican Fellowship (IAF) will be sent to parishes of the Polish Catholic Church in Poland (Sister Church to the PNCC) which is undertaking regular humanitarian relief efforts on behalf of the Ukrainian refugees
