Scripture Insights

Peter's sermon (Acts 2) interprets Psalm 16 as prophecy about Christ's death, resurrection, and exaltation—foreordained by God for salvation. Equally part of God's plan is the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, which Peter's audience now experiences directly. Earlier in Acts, Jesus promises that the Spirit will empower his followers for witness, proclamation, and prophecy (Acts 1:8; 2:4, 17), enabling the Gospel to reach the ends of the earth (1:8; 13:47).

The second reading emphasizes foreknowledge: the incarnation, death, and resurrection of Christ was part of God's plan

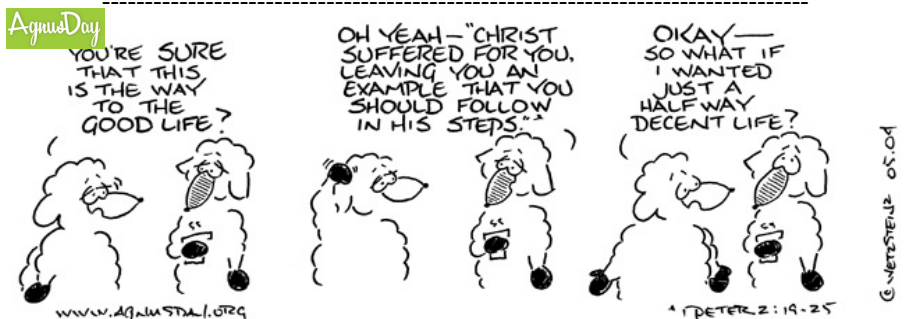

even before creation. The comparison of Jesus to a "spotless, unblemished lamb" (1 Peter 1:19) echoes both instructions for the Passover meal in Exodus 12:5 and instructions for sacrifices in Leviticus 3—5, including offerings for communal well-being (3:6—7), atonement for unintended wrongdoing (4:32, 35), and expiation for sin (5:6). The Passover meal protected the Israelites from death on the eve of their journey to freedom. While the sacrifices detailed in Leviticus each had differing functions, together they oriented life toward God, strengthened bonds of community, and repaired the damages of sin

and wrongdoing. Jesus' own self-sacrifice functions in similar ways.

The Gospel reading thematizes this relationship between "the Scriptures" (i.e., the Old Testament) and the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. The repeated motif of "opening" portrays perception of previously hidden truth: Jesus "opens" the Scriptures to Cleopas and Simon, explaining how earlier scriptures spoke about him. When he breaks and blesses the bread, their eyes are "opened" and they recognize their risen Lord.

- What does it mean that Cleopas' and Simon's hearts were "burning" (Luke 24:32)?
- Why is the blood of Christ a more suitable ransom than silver or gold (1 Peter 1:18)?
- How can you give witness to the resurrection in your words and actions?

Practice of Faith

The Mass is an opportunity for the Lord Jesus to walk with you, just as he did with the disciples walking to Emmaus. How can you recognize him? At Mass, allow your heart to burn with what you hear

him say to you in the readings and in the homily. It is he, the Word made flesh, who speaks. Gaze with love upon Christ becoming present as the bread is broken by the priest. Receive his blessed Body and Blood knowing that he journeys with you and strengthens you until the end of time. Realize Christ's true presence this week:

- At Mass, close your eyes and imagine Jesus celebrating the Eucharist.
- Spend time in Eucharistic Adoration allowing Jesus to be present to your heart.
- Meditate on this Gospel and allow Jesus to appear to you on the road to Emmaus. Allow yourself to see Jesus as the disciples did.

Questions

- We hear from Peter twice today: first in the reading from Acts, and then in the letter we now call "First Peter." In Acts, Peter expounds on what the community has experienced. Why do you think he recounts this experience? Do signs need to be explained? Why or why not?
- Peter speaks a message of hope to the people. He compares their experience to that of the people of Israel as they wandered in exile. Look carefully at this passage for the phrases and themes that echo the Book of Exodus.
- The story of the Road to Emmaus is an icon of our journey with Jesus. Who are you in this story right now? Are you at the start of the journey, the middle, or the end? Is our journey with Jesus always linear? Why or why not?

Family Activities

- Peter draws on his experience as a Jew in placing Christ within the story of a promised Messiah. The Light of Faith extols the place of the Jews in Christian salvation history. Why is it critical for Catholics to know and embrace this expansive understanding of God's love for the Jewish people?
- Take time to learn something about Judaism this week through reading, research, conversation, or a visit to home or synagogue.
- Close your eyes and recount the story of the Road to Emmaus. Place yourself in it as one of the two travelers, and see if this

meditation deepens your experience of the story and your faith.

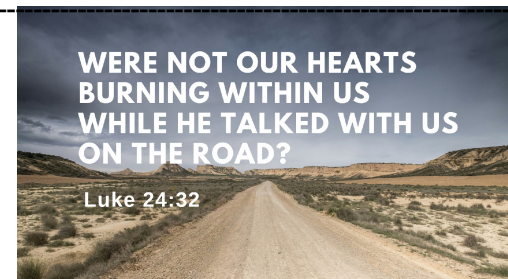

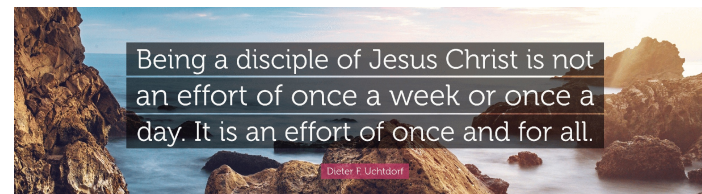

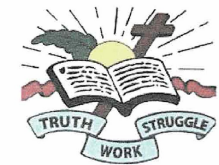
