Almost certainly, Jesus varied the nuances of His message to fit the needs of His listeners in the many places He preached the Gospel. Luke and Matthew agree on the main ideas of the Gospel message, but in their summaries of Jesus' preaching, they depict Him in very different ways. Matthew's Sermon on the Mount (Matthew -7:29) portrays Jesus as a new Moses, delivering the words of the new covenant from a mountaintop pulpit. Luke, by contrast, portrays Jesus as a philosopher. In Luke's Sermon on the Plain (6:20–49), Jesus gathers His disciples around Him in an out-of-the-way place and



shares the moral teaching on which He has built His ministry.

Integrity is essential and hypocrisy the ultimate sin. In this, Jesus is in line with His Jewish faith, which insists that one love God with all one's heart, soul, and strength (Deuteronomy 6:5). Hands and voice must follow the heart; anything else is fraud. Jesus is very concerned that His disciples live with integrity. He knows how easy it is to fall into hypocrisy and how easy it is to be fooled by the hypocrisies of others. He also knows how destructive hypocrisy can be. Hypocrites inevitably reveal their empty faith, and this can inspire cynicism or confusion in others.

By contrast, integrity has a multiplier effect. When disciples express their faith in God through kindness, generosity, mercy, and forgiveness, they inspire similar efforts and faith in the people they encounter. The fruits of goodness sustain the lives of others and can inspire weary hearts to place their faith in God.

Lent begins in a few days. Perhaps this Sunday's readings offer a challenge to look carefully for the wooden beams in our eyes and to use the austerities of Lent to restore the clear sight needed to establish God's kingdom of justice.

- How can you live with greater integrity?
- What wooden beam can you remove from your eye?
- When the voice of your heart speaks, are the words full of hate or love?

Practice of Faith

At the heart of today's Gospel is a call to live with integrity. To be a person of integrity means there is congruence with who we say we are and what we say and do. Integrity is the antidote to hypocrisy. Lent begins this week. The season of repentance offers an opportunity to look at our lives with honesty and to seek to prune away anything that impairs our ability to live with integrity.

- Take today's instructive Gospel to heart. What is within you that produces goodness and kindness and what tears it down?
- Ash Wednesday serves as the doorway to a time of intense spiritual preparation leading to Easter and continuing through Pentecost. Make a deliberate plan to cross the threshold into Lent by arranging your calendar to attend Ash Wednesday services.
- How is God calling you to journey through Lent? Begin to formulate ideas about how you will incorporate the spiritual Continued on Page 12

practices of Lent—prayer, fasting, and almsgiving (acts of charity) —into your life throughout the weeks ahead.

Questions

- Who do you know whose speech displays their goodness and love for others?
- How have you made gratitude to God a part of your life?
- How would you describe the fruit by which you are known?

Family Activities

- At the end of the day, examine your speech. What have your words revealed about you?
- What gift from God do you take for granted? Thank God for its presence in your life.
- Lent begins on Wednesday. Spend some time alone thinking about what practice you can take up that will help you grow spiritually.


