**Scripture Insights**

Without light, we cannot see. We cannot see the path before us, dangers that surround us, or the faces of those with whom we are called into relationship. Darkness can foster fear, loneliness, confusion, and despair. The psalmist declares that God's light makes it possible to see God's goodness. It is a source of protection, courage, and hopeful expectation.

For the prophet Isaiah, this gift of light in darkness was the promise of a future. A day would dawn for God's people when, against all odds, God would liberate them from oppression at the hands of an ancient empire. The relationship of domination would

### SOUP FOR SENIORS



not be reshaped but broken. Conquered no longer, God's people would know victory. Exploited no longer, they would rejoice in the fruit of their own labor.

For Matthew, the new day Isaiah envisioned for God's people dawned in the person of Jesus and the proclamation of God's kingdom. Jesus called followers in plain language that matched the shape of their lives. They were laborers, and their skills were transferable. The first fisher-disciples risked their lives on the water. They were practiced at teamwork. They were accustomed to long hours and arduous labor. They were patient, attentive, and responsive to changing conditions. They were resourceful, even doing their own repair work, They would apply all these skills in their ministry of preaching and healing.

Yet the letter to the Corinthians names obstacles to the Church's apostolic mission. One is division. Another, leaders who center their own authority in the place of Christ's. Yet another, drowning out the Gospel with words that sound good but lack substance. The solution to each problem is the same: centering in word and deed the Gospel of a crucified Christ.

- What do you think it means when the psalmist requests "to dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life"?
- What is the significance of Jesus' healing ministry? How does that relate to the kingdom of heaven?

- What skills do you use every day? How might you contribute those skills to the Church's mission?

**Practice of Faith**

Jesus called the apostles to do something they had never done before. They were going into unknown territory. Just as He asked the apostles, Jesus asks us to follow, to leave our safety nets and go where He leads us. In *Story of a Soul*, St. T r se of Lisieux teaches us, "We must abandon our future into the hands of God." The apostles are the perfect model for this type of faith. They left the familiar and trusted that Jesus had something better in store for them. How can we learn this type of trust in God? Try the following:

- Meditate on today's Gospel. Imagine Jesus calls you with Peter, Andrew, James, and John. Walk with Jesus and the apostles. Ask Jesus to keep you safe on the unknown journey.
- When receiving Communion this week, ask Jesus to help you have total trust in Him.
- Start a faith journal and write about what might be hindering you from completely trusting God.

**Questions**

- We hear the first part of this reading proclaimed at Mass at midnight on Christmas Eve. It is a messianic prophecy of great beauty and power. Which of these promises feels most resonant to you right now? Why?
- Paul exhorts the community at Corinth to remember that they are one community, not a fragmented group of rivals. What does being "united in the same mind and in the same purpose" mean to you?
- In the Gospel, we hear the verses from Isaiah echoed. They affirm that Jesus is the fulfillment of this promise. He then calls the first disciples, James and John. What is your reaction to their response to him? What do you think of them leaving their boats and their father?

**Family Activities**

- The prophet Isaiah speaks of smashing the yoke and rod of the

taskmaster. While many of us think of slavery as something that has been abolished, people are, in fact, enslaved all over the world, including secretly in the United States. Take some time this week to learn something about contemporary abolition efforts.

- Paul addressed the people of Corinth in a time of interior crisis. They are splitting into factions, and Paul exhorts them to unity. Do you see the parish, or the national or global Church, splitting into factions in any way? Pray for the healing and unity of the Church this week.
- Jesus calls James and John from their work. They have to put down their nets to follow him. Are there any nets standing between you and Jesus? What reasons keep you from putting them down? Bring this inquiry to your prayer this week.




This winter, collect **first aid supplies** to deliver to needy individuals or to the agencies that help them. Prepare a kit for your home as well!



The Red Cross recommends that all first aid kits for a family of four include the following:

- 2 absorbent compress dressings (5 x 9 inches)
- 25 adhesive bandages (assorted sizes)
- 1 adhesive cloth tape (10 yards x 1 inch)
- 5 antibiotic ointment packets (approximately 1 gram)
- 5 antiseptic wipe packets
- 2 packets of aspirin (81 mg each)

- 1 emergency blanket
- 1 breathing barrier (with one-way valve)
- 1 instant cold compress
- 2 pair of nonlatex gloves (size: large)
- 2 hydrocortisone ointment packets (approximately 1 gram each)
- 1 3 in. gauze roll (roller) bandage
- 1 roller bandage (4 inches wide)
- 5 3 in. x 3 in. sterile gauze pads
- 5 sterile gauze pads (4 x 4 inches)
- Oral thermometer (non-mercury/nonglass)
- 2 triangular bandages
- Tweezers
- Emergency First Aid instructions




**God and All Things**




