Scripture Insights

Today's psalm expresses joy and thanksgiving at the miraculous deeds of a God who overturns the valuations of this world, delivers from death, and works wonders from unlikely materials and circumstances. Witnesses of God's power for life must declare it to others.

On such a joyful day, it is startling that the Gospel reading emphasizes confusion. Resurrection cracks open the limits of what we thought possible. Mary of Magdala, Simon Peter, and the beloved disciple look for the body of the Lord. They find an empty tomb and burial cloths rolled and stowed in a neat bundle. Like Lazarus before

him (John 11:44), Jesus no longer had need of them. Yet, even for those who have hoped in the resurrection, the evidence of life

beyond death is so unexpected and shocking that other explanations compete for belief. Mary's encounter with the risen Christ prompts recognition, understanding (John 20:16), and witnessing (John 20:17-18).

Peter's sermon continues this work of witnessing, a theme that recurs throughout the passage. "We are witnesses of all that he did ... witnesses chosen by God in advance," commissioned to testify. The prophets, too, "bear witness." To witness is not simply to see. It is to give reliable testimony. Modes of witnessing, according to Peter, include prophecy and preaching. Its content includes Jesus' ministry and miracles, his death and resurrection, and his future role as judge of living and dead. Its purpose is for the forgiveness of sins. Participants in the Mass will hear elements of the Nicene Creed in Peter's sermon. In reciting the Creed, we too give witness to the risen Christ.

Christians also give witness in the shape of our lives. In the waters of baptism, Christians participate in Christ's death in order also to participate in Christ's resurrection. Jesus' ascension to heaven provides a point of orientation, ordering desire and will toward "what is above."

- What connections do you see between the cornerstone (Psalm 118:22) and the resurrection story?
- How is seeing related to believing in the readings from Acts and the Gospel according to John?
- Have you ever struggled to process good news? What made it difficult?

Practice of Charity

The empty tomb is a sign of hope and new life. It tells us Jesus Christ defeated death. Fresh air fills the tombs of our hearts where sin once decayed our souls. Jesus is risen! Alleluia! Because of this, we are raised in baptism and share the hope of eternal life. What are we to do with this gift? Like Mary, we are charged with sharing this news. St. Paul tells us to "think of what is above, not of what is on earth." Our focus lies beyond the empty tomb. We are to announce the good news of the resurrection. Where do we start? This week:

- Pray in thanksgiving for the gift of the resurrection. Share this news with others with a banner display outside your home or on social media.

- Plan acts of kindness to honor the resurrection; help others empty their spiritual tombs.
- Help others, especially in your family, to understand what Christ's resurrection means for us.

Questions

- The first reading from the Acts of the Apostles is part of the story of the conversion of Cornelius, a Roman army officer. This is a powerful story of Peter's first interaction with a Gentile. What does this story convey? Why is it significant?
- In baptism we die with Christ and are incorporated into his resurrection. Why must we continue to seek what's "above" even in this life? How is it that part of life remains "hidden" from us? What does this mean to you?
- Mary of Magdala, apostle to the apostles, finds the stone rolled away from the tomb. She rushes back to her brothers, and they return quickly to the tomb. It is empty. What is their reaction? What do you make of the tension of seeing and believing versus not seeing and believing? In what ways is this the core challenge of faith?

Family Activities

- Read the reading from Acts in its full context to experience the story of Cornelius.
- In the early Church, people (at first adults) were baptized by immersion. In what ways is going under water symbolic of death? In what ways might taking a breath after coming up out of the waters of baptism feel like new life? Talk to someone who has experienced immersion baptism and ask them to tell you what it was like for them.
- Mary of Magdala is one of the most faithful and inspiring female figures of the Gospel. Find out more about her this week, learning to distinguish what the Gospels actually say from ideas that became attached to her in later centuries of Christianity.

Please join us next Sunday as we transform our Cake & Coffee reception into a semi-"Święconka" Brunch, sharing many of the traditional culinary Polish Easter delights. It is Good to Celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord with family.

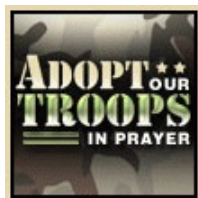

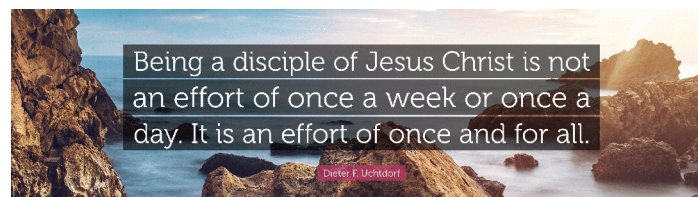

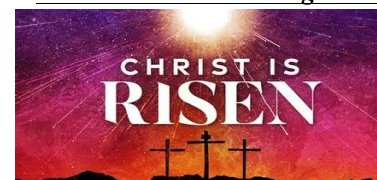


We Each Have Our Own Path

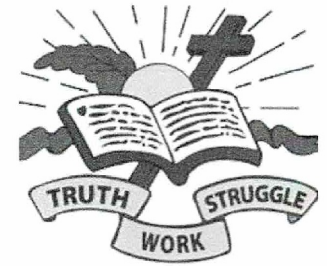

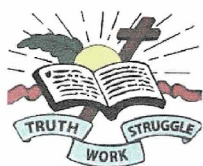
