Scripture Insights

In today's first reading from the Book of Wisdom, we hear that God loves all that God has created. What an affirmation of the goodness of the entire cosmos! Additionally, the author of this text emphasizes that God is both merciful and forgiving. This depiction of God is affirmed in today's responsorial psalm.

Meanwhile, the author of the Second Letter to the Thessalonians reminds the community that the coming of the Lord Jesus is not likely to take place soon. It seems that there were rumors circulating that



the Lord would return in the near future. And while the Lord's return would take place, the author wants the community to live out their faith until that unknown time.

Luke's Gospel provides the only account of the tax collector named Zacchaeus. Since the Romans depended on the tax collectors to acquire funds, the Jews often despised them. This small tax collector "was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see Him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature" (19:3). How disturbed the crowd must have been when they heard that Jesus would stay in the home of Zacchaeus! And how shocked Zacchaeus must have been at this news!

Once again, we have a Gospel story that depicts Jesus in a way that we might find surprising. Jesus does not follow the common practice of despising a tax collector. While Zacchaeus sought Jesus, Jesus sought Zacchaeus. And the response of this tax collector is one of immediate repentance. He offers half of his possessions to the poor and then proclaims that he will repay fourfold anyone whom he has wronged.

Confronted with the love of Jesus, Zacchaeus recognizes who he is and desires to be different. In seeking Jesus, Zacchaeus was found.

- Reread today's passage from Wisdom. Reflect on the words "You have mercy on all." Consider the ways that God has been merciful to you.
- Have you, like Zacchaeus, sought to see Jesus? How have you pursued him?
- Reflect on Jesus' words to Zacchaeus. How would you respond if Jesus told you that he wanted to dine with you this evening?

Practice of Hope

Sometimes we don't see the goodness that is within and around us. Who do you think God sees when looking at you? Are you like Zacchaeus, eager for God to find you, or are there parts of yourself that you are trying to hide from God?

- Imagine what it was like for Zacchaeus. Feel the joy of welcoming Jesus' presence within you. As Zacchaeus tried to see Jesus, people in the crowd might have deliberately prevented him.
- Zacchaeus oversaw the collection of taxes for Rome, and so people condemned him as a sinner. Is there someone whose relationship with God you might have misjudged? Pray for that person. What might that person's relationship with God really be?
- If you can, spend some time outside. Reflect on all that God has fashioned. Cherish the things God has made, from the largest to the smallest.

Questions

- In today's first reading we hear, "[Y]our imperishable spirit is in all things! Therefore you rebuke offenders little by little." How might this insight about God's presence in everything and patience with all things change the way you view people and things around you?
- Paul says that he is praying for each in the community that God may "powerfully bring to fulfillment every good purpose and every effort of faith." Is there someone in your life for whom you would like to pray that prayer?
- In what ways do we find ourselves climbing a tree, like Zacchaeus, so we can have a better view of Jesus? Who are the rich today who use their authority to extort people? Have we ever been guilty of such extortion?

Family Activities

Jesus says in the Gospel that He has come "to seek and to save what was lost." That is our work also and one of the means by which we allow God to find the parts of us that are lost. So what sort of seeking and saving work is right for you? Pray for guidance, talk to a friend, or write in your journal, asking to be led to the situations that need you.

- Both the first reading from Wisdom and today's responsorial psalm (145) point to God's love and care for creation. Read the First Reading reflectively and then pray the Responsorial Psalm from your heart. Join yourself to the great chorus of all God's works thanking him.
- This is the Month of All Souls. It has been said that November is the time when the Church rehearses for death. Join your prayer to the great cloud of witnesses who have gone before us, marked with the sign of faith—those named and unnamed.



Our Communion of Saints

The saints and blesseds are special signs of God's activity. Their surrender to God's love was so generous an approach to the total surrender of Jesus that the Church recognizes them as heroes and heroines worthy to be held up for our inspiration. They remind us that the Church is holy, can never stop being holy, and is called to show the holiness of God by living the life of Christ.

Our holiness is the same as theirs—God's holiness. Their lives were indeed conditioned by the culture and history of their own day; their expression of holiness is partly different from what it would be in the twenty-first century. But the essence is the same: They received God's gift with joy. They call to us to do likewise: "Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person; for the temple of God, which you are, is holy" (1 Cor 3:16–17).
