Scripture Insights

According to 1 Peter, Christ's resurrection is not the end in itself but a new beginning—the foundation for a future that God has planned for God's chosen and holy people. The resurrected Christ reveals this future and makes it possible. Those who respond to faith's invitation will, like Christ, become living stones out of which God builds a house of worship. As a priestly people, they help others draw near to and live in communion with God.

A different architectural metaphor appears in John 14:1—12. Jesus has promised to "prepare a place" for His disciples, noting that

SOUP FOR SENIORS

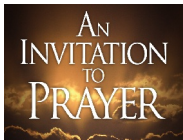

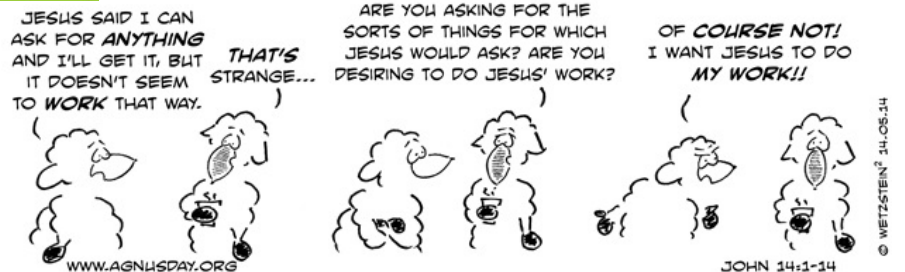

"in my Father's house there are many dwelling places" (14:2). Thomas' question literalizes the metaphor, seeking GPS coordinates to locate the heavenly bed and breakfast. But, like the "spiritual house" of 1 Peter 2:5, this "place" is not an actual building. It is intimacy with God the Father. The directions to this place stand before them in the person of Jesus, Who is himself "the way" (John 14:6).

Jesus calls attention to the works of the Father (John 14:11—12). In Psalm 33:4, a poetic parallelism identifies two causes for praise: God's words and God's works. Through words, God bridges the gulf dividing God from humanity, revealing God's intentions for creation and all life within it. Through works, God provides, enacts justice and mercy, and protects and saves God's people.

Word and works are not opposed to each other, but are synergistic. In the first reading, a similar pair appears in the references to two distinct but related ministries: word and table. These, too, are synergistic. Body and soul are nourished in tandem, and neither can be neglected. Recognition of that balance and pairing mirrors the community's discernment regarding the equal participation of and provision for different groups in the early Church.

- In the diaconal ordination rite described in Acts 6:6 (cf. 8:17), what does "laying hands" signify or accomplish?
- What does Jesus mean when He calls Himself "the way"?
- How can your faith help others draw nearer to God?

Practice of Hope

"Do not let your hearts be troubled" (John 14:1). Jesus says this

to us when we suffer worry and loss. Jesus gave us "the way" to navigate dark times. Jesus is The Way and He walks with us through prayer. He assures us he will do anything asked in His Name. There is no other way of Christian prayer than Christ. Whether our prayer is communal or personal, vocal or interior, it has access to the Father only if we pray 'in the Name' of Jesus. The sacred humanity of Jesus is therefore the way by which the Holy Spirit teaches us to pray to God our Father". Practice the Jesus prayer this week.

- At home, before the cross, tell Jesus of your worries. Lay them at the foot of his Cross. Ask Jesus to resurrect these burdens into hope and strength in His holy Name.

Questions

- Although Jews lived throughout the Greco-Roman world, there was some animosity between Greeks and Jews. Here we see the leaders of the new Christian community overcoming a historical divide. The twelve, a number representative of the twelve tribes of Israel, chose seven, a number that represents perfection. What does this reveal to you about reconciliation and growth, both then and now?
- The exquisite metaphor of the letter from Peter, in which we are called to become "living stones" is vivid. What does it communicate to you? To all of us?
- In this passage from John's account of the Gospel, Jesus' disciples are full of confusion and anxiety. They do not want to let go of Him again. Jesus offers three reassurances. What are they? Which speaks to your heart right now?

Family Activities

- Think about people beyond the parish staff who are dependable leaders in your community. How were they identified or called? Take a moment to acknowledge someone who has been "filled with the Spirit and wisdom" in your community and for the betterment of the whole.
- In the pattern of Jesus, a stone that is rejected becomes the cornerstone. What does this imply? Can you think of Christians who have lived this pattern? Who are they? Journal and share your thoughts.
- Today's Gospel is often used at funeral Masses. It is deeply comforting to know that those we love are saints of God who

have joined Jesus in a place He has prepared for them. Who in your life has gone to this "house with many dwelling places"? Envision them there in the company of Jesus in your prayer this week.

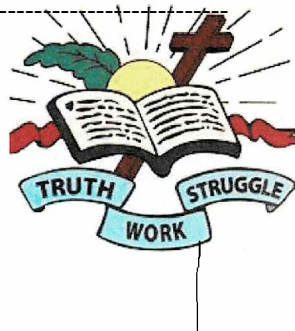

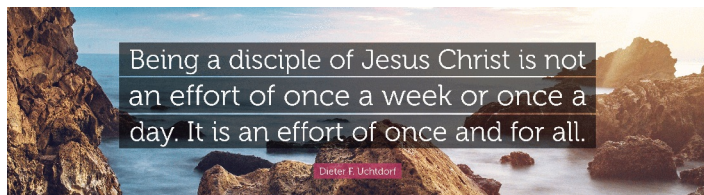

We will be collecting donations through the entire month. Checks can be made out to “HTC” and in the lower left hand note, simply write “Meals on Wheels.”



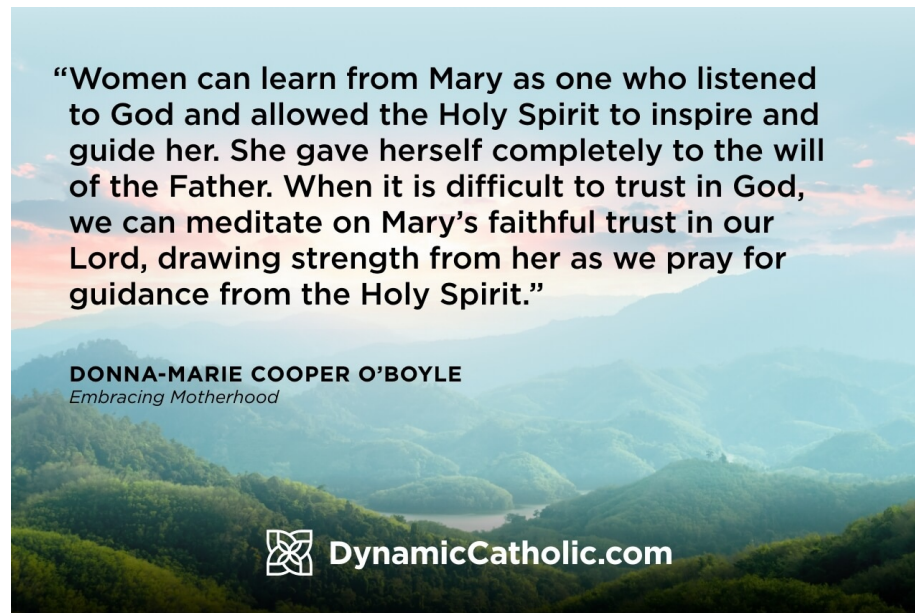

The Beauty of Our Beginnings

Psalm 139 takes us all the way back to when we first became. It reveres the beauty of our very beginnings and returns us to the miracle of our mothers. Even being carried within a womb, as each and every one of us was, God met us there. How many times have we heard, “You're born alone and you die alone”? Psalm 139 dispels this, assuring us that even before our birth, when we were being woven, kneaded, and knitted, we had a holy spirit paralleling us. Could there be anything more comforting than this belief, that we had this connection to God way back, starting within the cocoon of our own creation? Psalm 139 offers a comfort that I would characterize as mystical. The mystical is that which brings you right into the heart of God, and brings God right into the heart of you. Psalm 139 is, and always will be, a gorgeous piece of writing expressing the truth that not only does God know each of us, God has actually been alongside us, in ways no human being ever could, because it's beyond what any person can ever do. It's too much to ask. It's impossible.

“Women can learn from Mary as one who listened to God and allowed the Holy Spirit to inspire and guide her. She gave herself completely to the will of the Father. 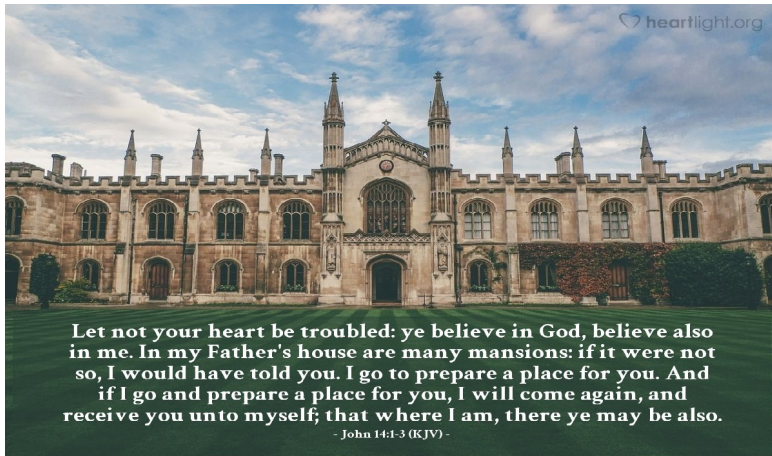
