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Today's readings display God's favor to the lowly and to those who choose to lower themselves. The wisdom of Sirach is the upside-down logic of God's kingdom: the more you humble yourself, the greater you are (Sirach 3:18). Or, to put it another way, the greater you are, the more you need to humble yourself.

Jesus refers to the same paradox when He sees people at a meal trying to choose the best seats at the table. He tells the guests to do the opposite: instead of seeking the seats of honor, they should seek out the lowest, least important seats. Sit in the back of the room or at the children's table, and then the host might elevate you to a

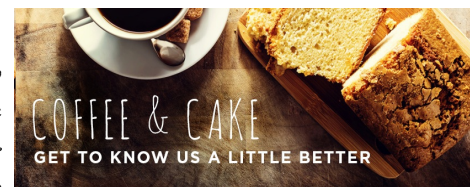

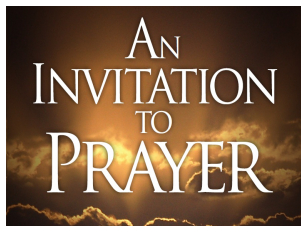

higher place. Likewise, he tells them not to invite their friends and relatives to a meal, but to invite instead the people who couldn't possibly return the favor. The phrase "wealthy neighbors" provides the clue to the social setting; the host is a person of means who can afford to put on a nice dinner. Then (and today), a wealthy person is unlikely to invite unhoused or impoverished people to their home.

Jesus seems to be telling his listeners to favor the same type of people that God favors. As the psalmist writes, God is the father of orphans, the defender of widows, and the provider for the needy.

The author of Hebrews points toward the heavenly Jerusalem, the "holy dwelling" of the living God (Psalm 68:5; Hebrews 12:22). Jesus is now the host at a heavenly banquet where all the just are gathered. Hebrews compares His Blood (shed on the cross) to the blood of Abel, which cried out from the ground after his brother Cain murdered him (Genesis 4:10). Unlike Abel, Jesus willingly chose to die to establish a new covenant between God and humanity.

- Why does Hebrews compare Jesus and Abel?
- Which categories of people does the psalmist associate with God? Why?
- Do you see yourself as great and in need of being humbled, or humble and in need of being lifted up?

Practice of Charity

Jesus uses a rule of etiquette to demonstrate a rule of God: only the truly humble have a place in God's kingdom. The dictates of today's Gospel are simple. As Christians, we are called to give freely, as God does, to those who cannot possibly repay the kindness; to give alms, to invite the poor and the marginalized into our lives.

- At every family dinner, pray especially for the poor.
- Contact your local refugee organization and inquire about inviting a refugee family in your community to your home for a meal.

Questions

- What instruction and wisdom might you take from Sirach? Why do you think humility is considered a fundamental attitude of wisdom and a sure foundation for life?
- What do you make of the images in the second part of the reading from the Letter to the Hebrews? Is the author painting a picture of heaven? Of the liturgy? How do these images speak to you?
- Do we refrain from taking a higher place out of a show of humility, knowing perfectly well that someone will make us move higher? The human psyche being so cunning, how can we authentically enter into the "law of the kingdom" in which "the one who humbles himself will be exalted"?

Activities

- Why might a wedding banquet be a perfect setting for Jesus' parable about the nature of God's kingdom? Talk with a friend or write in your journal about how wedding banquets you have experienced express the sense of a loving and inclusive community.
