### **Scripture Insights**

Today's readings can be better understood when placed within their historical context. The first reading from the Second Book of Maccabees recounts the circumstances of Judaism in the latter part of the second century before Christ. It was during this time that belief in the resurrection from the dead was emerging within parts of Judaism. Not all Jews believed in resurrection. Among those that believed in the resurrection were the Pharisees; among those that did not believe in the resurrection were the Sadducees. While there were other sects within Judaism, it is these two groups that are often



referred to in the Gospels.

Today's first reading is part of a text that recounts the story of a mother and her seven sons. Each member of this family was killed for refusing to disobey the law by eating food that was forbidden them to eat. Each bravely faced death rather than break God's command, and each believed that God would raise them to new life.

Our Gospel from Luke, written in the first century, presents a story of some Sadducees, who placed a question to Jesus regarding the resurrection and marriage.

While the Sadducees did not believe in the resurrection, they confronted Jesus with a situation that forced him to respond. Another teaching of Judaism, and one held by the Sadducees, was that, when a male sibling died without offspring, it was the responsibility of the next brother to provide a child for his sibling's widow. When they confront Jesus with the question, "at the resurrection whose wife will that woman be?" (20:33), Jesus is compelled to respond to the Sadducees in a manner to which they were accustomed. He refers to another portion of Scripture to emphasize the point that God is the God of the living, not of the dead.

- Reflect on when you were faced with a decision that would go against your beliefs. How did you confront this diffculty?
- Reread today's responsorial psalm. Which lines in this psalm speak to your heart?
- How do you envision the resurrection?

### **Practice of Hope**

At the time of Jesus, not all Jews believed in an afterlife. The seven brothers in the first reading believed in the resurrection of the

just, whereas others, such as the Sadducees, did not. Jesus' resurrection ensures that there is new life to come.

- What stories, paintings, and other art strengthen your hope in the life to come? Choose an image of the risen Jesus. Pray with this image, asking God to complete his glorification of all creation.
- Are you scared of death? Share your fears with the Lord. What should you do to prepare for death, not only spiritually, but in other aspects of your life?
- During November we especially remember those who have died.
   Pray today's responsorial psalm on behalf of those who have died, especially those who died young or who died a violent death.

### Questions

- How does the story in the first reading strike you? Is it too gruesome for your sensibilities? Is it edifying? What stories of modern-day martyrs do you find inspiring?
- From the second reading, what can you tell about Paul's belief in the power of prayer? Who do we ask for prayers? How do we believe it will help us?
- What parts of today's responsorial psalm echo the way Jesus describes the afterlife?

### Family Activities

- On November 11, the Church celebrates the Memorial of St. Martin of Tours. St. Martin took seriously Jesus' admonition to care for the poor. Go through your home and gather clothing you no longer need to give to a thrift shop.
- In today's Gospel, some Sadducees, who deny the resurrection of the dead, try to trip up Jesus. Take time this week to understand the tenet that we profess in the Creed each week: "I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come."
- Our parish has its own cemetery. The cemetery committee of the parish provides oversight with parish committee oversight. Learn more about the cemetery, talk to the committee members, visit the cemetery and consider supporting it.



### Identity, Justice, and Community

We will not appreciate Jesus' loyalty to the Law and the Prophets if we do not accept his deeper understanding of freedom. I'm afraid that the cry of the French Revolution, "Liberty, equality, and fraternity," has formed us much more than the Jesus Revolution. His cry might instead be "Identity, justice, and community." Think about the difference. We also tend to think of freedom as freedom of movement and the liberty to choose between options. This is surely a good and important freedom. There is no indication that the great spiritual teachers, Jesus included, see it as essential, however. They seem to recognize that the world of preferences and possibilities does not of itself lead to wisdom, truth, or even depth of experience. In fact, in the spiritual life, the rule seems to be that less is more. There is almost no correlation between the number of options and the amount of truth or goodness that one attains.
