Scripture Insights

John the Baptizer's preparation for the way of Jesus involves participation in Jesus' way. Like Jesus, John the Baptizer is arrested by the authorities (1:14). Jesus' arrival in Mark is about the coming of God's reign (1:15). The time has come for all other kingdoms or empires to end. We need to trust this Good News by orienting ourselves to a different direction and renouncing all existing forms of dominion (the Greek word translated as repent means a changing or a transformation of the mind). Because Jesus' way is not the way of

The prayer time is structured and Scripture-based. No advance preparation required. You only need to show up. Contact Karen Sobiechowski for questions or if you would like to participate.







The Cause of Our Joy

Christian joy is not simply a superficial feeling of heightened delight or the emotion accompanying extreme pleasure. It does not necessarily depend upon one's immediate circumstances or fortune, as taught by Saint Francis's example. It does not ignore or deny the troubling reality of indifference, hopelessness, or disappointment. Christian joy lies beyond the realm of feelings and emotions. It is a fundamental disposition and stance toward life. Descriptive metaphors for it abound: It is the knowledge that having prayed and surrendered, God hears the hopes and desires of my heart and will respond in a timely, appropriate way. God is my shepherd and I must trust God's heart. Joy feeds on the fact that God stands watch over every situation in my life and guides me with rod and staff. My joy sometimes bubbles up, sometimes surges up, from the rock-bottom certainty that the finger of God is somehow present in every tragic or trivial event. Joy is the oasis residing in the confident conviction that the waters of God's loving care and concern never run dry—not even in the desert. The gratuity of grace is always unending and never expiring. Joy is rooted in the reality of a stone door rolled back from its tomb. Sowing seeds of joy amid sadness requires the two fundamentals of soul training: prayer—invoking assurance and confidence that God is looking out for us—and action—a servant's surrender and acceptance of consequences without clinging to fears, attachments, control needs, and a sense of entitlement. Both prayer and action plant a servant's feet in the footprints that lead beyond the tomb of Lazarus and the cross of Calvary.

those in power, preparing or following Jesus' way inevitably involves conflict. What we prepare for and follow is the way of the cross. John the Baptizer will be beheaded (Mark 6:14—29).

Jesus' early disciples illustrate what Paul suggests in 1 Corinthians 7:29—31. In contrast to Jonah, who took his time responding to God's call before he finally carried God's message to Nineveh in Jonah 3, they respond to Jesus' call immediately—and they not only drop their usual business but also leave their family. Work and family are structures that support or conventions that govern our lives over time. Mark and Paul tell us that the coming of God's reign requires us to renounce our ties to, and our dependence on, ways that sustain our lives over time because Jesus' way is not a way to ensure the continuation of one's life through property or progeny. It is the way of the cross.

Psalm 25 and Jonah 3 remind us of God's love and mercy. The way of the cross does not mean that God wills or wants us to suffer and die as if God were a sadist. God only calls us to live by God's reign, but the cross may become inevitable because there are those who prefer the perpetuation of the status quo to the coming of God's reign.

- What do we have to lose, or what are we afraid of losing today?
- How do we reconcile God's love and mercy with Jesus' cross?
- What causes us to procrastinate and keeps us from embracing a sense of urgency?

Practice of Faith

When Jonah warned the people of Nineveh of God's impending punishment, they promptly repented. When Jesus summoned the Galilean fishermen to participate in the proclamation of God's

kingdom, they promptly joined Him. When we hear St. Paul urging the Christians in Corinth not to become preoccupied by worldly concerns, we hear that same invitation to ask ourselves if we are truly living as God intends or if we need to make changes in our lives.

- Scrutinize your life. What do you spend time on? What do you spend money on?
- When Jesus called his first disciples, they immediately left everything behind. Is there something in your life you need to walk away from completely?
- Do you know someone who might join you in making meaningful life changes? Talk with that person about how you can support each other.

Questions

- When in your life have you made a major change in direction? Where did the impetus for change come from? Did the change come easily, or with great effort?
- Who has played prophet in your life, warning or challenging you to live differently? How did you feel about the message when you first heard it?
- Could you do what Andrew, Peter, James, and John did and abandon the life you know to embrace the uncertainty offered by Jesus? Why do you think they were able to say yes to Him?

Family Activities

- Research the life of a historical figure who embraced dramatic change to pursue his or her destiny. What do you most admire about this person? What aspects of his or her story would be too hard for you to accept?
- Speak with a neighbor, with your pastor, or your supervisor at work about something you think needs to be fixed. Compare and contrast their reactions with the response of the Ninevites.
- Give up something you enjoy for a week, cold turkey. At the end of the week, reflect on how easy or difficult it was to suddenly let go of something important to you.
