Scripture Insights

This Sunday the Gospel for Sexagesima (Pre-Lent II) presents the first in a series of controversies between Jesus and the Jewish scribes and Pharisees. It centers on whether Jesus has the authority to forgive sins. Up to this point, we have heard from the opening chapter of Mark's Gospel account, which describes the start of Jesus' public ministry. Jesus is successfully preaching and healing in the name of the kingdom of God, with His fame as a miracle worker quickly spreading throughout the region of Galilee. Beginning in


What delicious treat will our seniors enjoy this Sunday?






Apostle to the Apostles

Except for the mother of Jesus, few women are more honored in the Bible than Mary Magdalene. Yet she could well be the patron of the slandered, since there has been a persistent legend in the Church that she is the unnamed sinful woman who anointed the feet of Jesus in Luke 7:36–50. Mary Magdalene was one of the many "who were assisting them [Jesus and the Twelve] out of their means." She was one of those who stood by the cross of Jesus with his mother. And of all the "official" witnesses who might have been chosen for the first awareness of the Resurrection, she was the one to whom that privilege was given. She is known as the "Apostle to the Apostles."

Is there a time when you were accused of something you did not do? What was your reaction?

Even though we know that Mary Magdalene is not the sinful woman she was confused with, why do you think people still do not seem to see her for the important role she played in Jesus' life and ministry?

chapter two, Mark now introduces a series of controversial stories in connection with Jesus' words and deeds.

The first controversy Jesus experiences is with the Jewish leaders, who object to Jesus granting forgiveness of sins to a paralyzed man. Mark has shown Jesus healing people of various diseases and afflictions (such as demonic possession and leprosy, as well as more common illnesses). But now we see a new element: Jesus connects His power to heal with His authority to forgive sins. This new claim to authority proves controversial to some because Jewish belief held that only God has the authority to forgive sins. For Jesus' opponents, this was nothing short of blasphemy. For Jesus' followers, this was amazing: "all were astounded and glorified God, saying, 'We have never seen anything like this!' "

In the Second Reading, Paul proclaims that "God is faithful." God does not give mixed messages of "yes" and "no." God is a consistent "yes" in fulfilling his promises to Israel. For Paul, the relationship that he, Timothy, and Silvanus experience with Jesus Christ, and the "installment" of the Spirit in their hearts, is once again God being faithful and saying "yes" to His people.

- In the First Reading from Isaiah, what is the "something new" that God is offering Israel?
- In what ways do you sense that the Spirit dwells in your heart?
- What causes you to glorify God?

Practice of Charity

Would that we all had four friends (or even one) who would bring us before the Lord Jesus in prayer as we read in today's Gospel! With love, faithfulness, and a bit of ingenuity, the friends gently placed the paralyzed (and sinful) man at the feet of Jesus—the compassionate healer of body and soul. What joy the friends must have felt when Jesus spoke words of healing and forgiveness, and their friend stood up and joined them in the walk home.

•With Lent almost upon us, can you befriend yourself, kneel before Jesus and request healing for whatever may be "paralyzing" you
