Jesus' parable is often called "the prodigal son" but this misses its deeper meaning. If we portray it as the parable of the father with two sons, we see how it challenges us to love without limits.

The father, at his younger son's request, sets him free, so that he can make his own choices and bear their consequences. The son's behest cannot be overstated. He had asked his father if they could pretend he is dead, so that the son could share the wealth. We see



that the son quickly dissipates his father's wealth and finds himself in the shocking reality of the unforgiving world. Coming to his senses, he intends to make amends and hope for mercy.

The father awaits his child's return and welcomes him back into the household with great joy and celebration. If we end here, however, we miss the real point. This father risks losing his older son, the one who has remained faithful and true. One was lost and has been found, but as we close, the father is outside, away from the rejoicing, trying to save his second son, to whom he says, "Everything I have is yours" (Luke 15:31). Jesus points to a Father who makes demands of all who follow, but these must be understood in the light of a Father who is found in unexpected places, searching for all his lost children.

What is lost must be found. This message stands, and this is what Paul confirms in his Second Letter to the Corinthians. Jesus reveals a different God expected and invented by the religious culture of His day. It holds power today because we continue to look for God in the wrong places. The God revealed by Jesus is as much a surprise to us as to His listeners. We enthrone God on altars when he is likely to be found out in the dark, trying to save his lost children.

- How do you close yourself off from the loving Father that Jesus presents here?
- How might you be open to the God Jesus reveals in the parable?
- In what ways can you join in seeking out and saving the lost in your daily life?

#### **Practice of Hope**

People often want their just rewards and so often identify with

the older son. Jesus tells this parable, however, to illustrate the depth of His Father's love and forgiveness. When we act like the younger brother and with selfish motives return home, God will run toward us, gushing with love because we headed in the right direction.

- Think about times when you were less than sincere in offering an apology. Journal about what happened next: did God or someone good in your life show the depth of forgiveness that exemplifies true love? How can you respond now to someone who needs this kind of mercy?
- When have you acted like the older brother and hardened your heart toward someone who sought forgiveness? Pray for a softening of your heart toward that person.
- When have you needed mercy and found it? Say a prayer of thanksgiving for that time.

#### **Questions**

- Why was the celebration of the first Passover in the promised land so significant to the people? How are Passover and the promised land important to us as Christians?
- In what ways do we believe that the Lord hears us when we call
  out, as in the last stanza of today's responsorial psalm? How are
  we fed by the table of God's Word and Eucharist?
- What does St. Paul mean when he says that the old things have passed away" and "new things have come"? In what ways are we allowing God to appeal to others through us? How does our communal renewal and Christian response through our reconciliation with Christ lead us to make a difference in this world?
- With today's Gospel in mind, we recognize that in the sacrament of penance and reconciliation the Father receives the repentant children who come back to him. How do we receive those from whom we are estranged? What could we do this Lent to invite those who have left the house of the Church, to lead them back?

#### **Activities**

- Take some time this week to reflect on old things in your life that have passed away. Rejoice that being one in Christ provides us with the opportunity to let go of the old and embrace the new.
- God is reconciling us to Himself through Christ. Explore service

opportunities in which you can become an ambassador for Christ, share in His ministry of reconciliation, and reach out to embrace all the broken members of our society and our world.

• If you are at odds with any family members or friends, pledge to take a step toward reconciliation this Lent. Then, like the prodigal son in today's Gospel, embrace forgiveness and celebrate this gift.

#### We All Need Healing

Rather than face what we fear, accepting that we need help, we deny our need for help, even to ourselves. At some point, we become so afraid of our wounds, so afraid of admitting we have a problem, that we hide our problems even from ourselves, engaging in mental gymnastics and reshaping the world so we can fit in as we are. We tell others we're fine, and we begin to believe it ourselves. We remain the walking wounded, trapped by sin and pain, yet ignorant of our situation. This is a huge stumbling block on our spiritual journeys as disciples. We cannot call ourselves disciples, those who follow after Jesus and call him master, if we refuse to let him transform every part of us. None of us is perfect. All of us carry wounds. If we want to be his disciples, we must let go of our pride and fear, our willful ignorance and low expectations, and be vulnerable enough to let Jesus heal us.
