**PASSION SUNDAY (Lent 5)

Isaiah speaks of the power and sovereignty of God, Who has a plan for creation and for each of us. The psalmist then promises that sadness will turn to joy and laughter if we stand strong. Paul, in his gentle Letter to the Philippians, further describes our faith lives as journeys pursuing maturity found in hope and satisfaction with God's blessings in whatever form they take.

This teaching culminates in our Gospel: an encounter among Jesus, a woman caught in adultery, and those who test Jesus to her

harm. This account is well known, but most early manuscripts do not include it. Remarkably, this powerful vignette was so loved that it nonetheless found a canonical home. Audiences of all time now experience this story of merciful wisdom and compassion.

Scribes and Pharisees bring a woman before Jesus as if to stand trial. They caught her in the very act of adultery, a crime punishable by stoning (Leviticus 20:10; Deuteronomy 22:22–24), and demand Jesus render judgment, but John confirms that Jesus too is on trial. The disinterest in the woman's partner shows that justice is of little concern. Jesus bends and writes in the sand. He whose words have flowed freely now refuses to speak, perhaps indicating they ask the wrong question. Jesus then responds with His encouragement to the one among them without sin to throw the first stone, and then He returns to his writing. One by one, the gathered depart until even the young move away.

The woman stands alone before Jesus. He asserts her autonomy as one who makes her own decisions and has her own relationship with God, then He sends her away with the command to change her ways accordingly.

- We are often curious about what Jesus writes, but we cannot know. What do you imagine He might have written?
- Jesus does not say words of forgiveness; rather, He agrees that no one remains to condemn the woman and sends her on her way. How might this act of mercy challenge her to live and do better?
- How does this Gospel culminate today's teachings?

Practice of Hope

The account of the woman caught in adultery is as much about the Pharisees and scribes who try to trick Jesus as it is about the woman. The woman may have been caught in the act of adultery, but these religious rulers wanted to persecute Jesus even more, because they were jealous and fearful of His growing influence.

- During these final days of Lent, discern what acts of sin or wrongful thinking are standing in the way of your being more open or present to others. How can you lay bare all of the hidden issues that prevent you from living fully with integrity and without regret?
- Make an effort to go to your parish's Lenten communal reconciliation service or regularly scheduled confession time.

Encourage others in your family or circle of faith-sharing friends to do the same as you prepare for the Paschal Triduum and Easter.

- Is there someone who is awaiting your mercy? Seek to reconcile with that person.

Questions

- In the first reading, God says, "I am doing something new!" Where do you find promise, liberation, and new freedom? In what ways are you doing something new or providing a drink for those thirsting for the face of God?
- The refrain for today's responsorial psalm says, "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy." Do we sometimes fail to recognize what God has done for us? How can we stay alert to these things and be ready to express our joy?
- St. Paul says that he depends on faith and on sharing in Christ's sufferings to know Him and the power of His resurrection. How have you grown closer to Christ and come to understand His Resurrection through your own suffering?

Activities

- Consider when you have judged a person, and say a prayer that God leads you to be open and forgiving to others.
- Pray this week for all those caught up in the vicious cycle of sex trafficking and slavery. Support programs and agencies that work to rescue those who are trapped in this way of life so that their dignity may be restored.
- As you look at your personal calendar, look ahead and make sure you have committed to being present for the celebration of the Paschal Triduum next week: Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Thursday, the Passion of the Lord on Friday, and the Easter Vigil on Saturday.

**ALMS TO HELP
AFGHAN REFUGEES**

At our February Parish Committee meeting it was decided to direct our Lenten Alms **Donations to Afghan Refugee Resettlement in Manchester**. 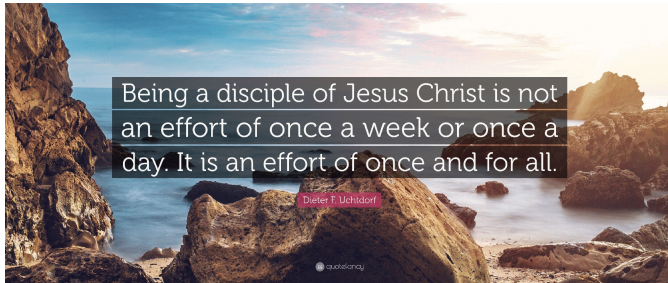
