Paul's Letter to the Philippians gave homage in the early Church to the Christ event. Paul describes Jesus as one in the form of God Who humbled Himself by taking on our form and going to a sacrificial death to exemplify the love God has for us. This early hymn shows how we recognize Jesus as Christ and Lord Who brings God's glory into our world.

Luke's passion is shaped by tradition. The Passover preparations and meal are unique as Jesus instructs the disciples on the

importance of service for the future mission. At the Mount of Olives, Jesus' prayer is framed by warnings against temptation, and His arrest in betrayal and violence, even as Jesus heals the high priest's injured slave. Peter's later denials, where he fails to identify with Jesus when challenged, are told before the account of Jesus' suffering. The assault during the arrest is met with healing, and Peter's betrayal is met with forgiveness and repentance.

At the trial before the Sanhedrin, Jesus accepts that He is the Christ, the Son of Man Who will come as the final judge, and the Son of God. The Roman trial follows, set around a visit to Herod. Jesus emerges as king and is eventually handed over to death by Pilate, who, nonetheless, declares Him innocent. Finally, with words of compassion and warning, Luke describes Jesus' road to the cross.

Jesus is crucified between criminals; He forgives His crucifiers, and He welcomes repentant sinners. While He commends His spirit into the Father's hands, the Roman centurion announces what many have known all along: "This man was innocent beyond doubt." All return home, beating their breasts in grief and ripe for repentance.

- What does Paul's hymn reveal about Jesus' suffering and death?
- How does Luke's passion narrative show Jesus as both prophet and savior?
- As Jesus ends his earthly mission in forgiveness, Luke sends us out in repentance and mission. What is your mission during this Holy Week?

***Practice of Charity***

In the first part of the passion Gospel from Luke, Jesus gives

another perspective to leadership when He tells His closest friends, "let the greatest among you be as the youngest, and the leader as the servant." Continuing His teaching on leadership, Jesus says, "I am among you as the one who serves."

- Consider any leadership role you have, whether in your family, at work, or among friends. How does this Gospel change your perspective on leadership? How can your leadership conform to the Gospel? Make concrete steps to change your leadership style.
- Consider workers in the service industry whom you encounter. How do you show appreciation?
- During this Holy Week, write a note to someone who has served you, perhaps a maintenance person at work or in the parish, a sales clerk, or a hostess at a restaurant and express your appreciation for their service.

### Questions

- At Mass today we carry palms, remembering the ancient custom enacted in Jerusalem as the people laid down palms on the road to acclaim Jesus as the prophet from Nazareth. But in our hearts, what are we laying down to honor him?
- In what ways do we witness the sufferings of Jesus? How do His sufferings echo in our own lives? During moments of humiliation, how are we looking to the Lord God, who is our help?
- Do you ever feel as if you are abandoned by God? Do you cry out in lament when you find yourself in the midst of loneliness or despair? What words could you use?

### Activities

- This week, spend some time thinking about people who, like Christ on the Cross, are suffering the most desperate situations—torture, helplessness, and humiliation. On their behalf, in their voice, pray today's responsorial psalm (Psalm 22).
- Place the blessed palms that you receive at today's Mass on a crucifix in your home. If you do not have a crucifix, consider acquiring one, and put it in a prominent place.
- The disciples who were gathered in the garden with Jesus fell asleep, and He chided them for this. Consider spending some time in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament at the altar of repose following the Holy Thursday liturgy. Will you stay awake and give one hour to our Lord?



**Grasping the Secret of the Cross**

Grasping the secret of the cross is not something we do once and for all. Sometimes we grasp it, and we are inside the circle of understanding; and sometimes we don't grasp it, and we are outside the circle of understanding.


For example, after Peter denies Jesus during the passion, the Gospels tell us that “Peter went outside.” They are referring to much more than simply stepping outside through some courtyard door. Peter was stepping outside the circle of both true discipleship and of a true understanding of life. His denial of Jesus took him “outside.” We too, in our following of Jesus, sometimes step “outside” when we give in to temptation or adversity. But then, if we repent, like Peter, we can step back “inside.”


