John narrates Mary of Magdala's coming to Jesus' tomb on the week's first day. Mary is alone and "it was still dark." For John, darkness can indicate lack of faith, and that is the case with Mary. She will come into the light but has a journey to travel. Seeing the stone removed, she rushes to Simon Peter and the Beloved Disciple to report the tomb emptied. Where is the executed Jesus? We know that God is the one involved, but they must still catch on.

Peter and the Beloved Disciple run to the tomb. Peter leads, but the other disciple passes him, sees that the signs of death are absent,



but relinquishes first entry. Peter has emerged as the leader, while the Beloved is the model disciple who both gives access and defers to his leader. We see the burial cloths rolled to one side, contrasting Jesus' raising of Lazarus, who was still bound. This is distinctive. Following into the empty tomb, the Beloved Disciple sees further evidence of death overcome by God. The burial cloths are folded and lain at opposite ends of the tomb. He believes (John 20:8). Peter's and Mary's responses are not recorded; their faith journeys need more time.

The disciples return home, as yet unaware of the Scripture of Jesus' resurrection. The Scripture is John's Gospel, and we eventually learn that we are blessed to have it (20:30—31). They witnessed, but we are summoned to believe because of that witness, to believe without seeing. Paul summons us likewise in his letter to the Colossians, as does Luke in the Acts of the Apostles. To find our place, we must "seek what is above" (Colossians 3:1).

- John claims that, despite our fears, death is not the end of Jesus' story. How does this offer you hope?
- Reflect on Jesus' summons to believe without seeing. How does this climax in the Easter story?
- In Acts, Peter comes to believe that all are accepted in the new *Continued on Page 11*

covenant. How might Christ appear in your life, even unexpectedly?

Practice of Hope

What a privilege for Mary of Magdala to be at the tomb of Jesus and to be among the first to begin a journey from darkness to light, a journey to faith. Christ's rising from the dead, conquering death, gave Mary hope and gives us hope today.

- Take time this week to observe the signs of new life around you.
 Be aware of budding trees, of young birds, of growth in your relationships. How can you care for any of the new life that surrounds you?
- Nurture new life at your parish by greeting people, especially those whom you do not know. Consider being a greeter for the parish.
- Do flower beds on your parish grounds need to be tended? Is there a community garden in your neighborhood at which you could volunteer? Think of other ways you can care for new life.

Questions

- In today's first reading, Peter succinctly tells the story of Jesus to a group of Gentiles (non-Jews, who have not inherited the stories and traditions of the Jews). How do you think the story of Jesus fits into the larger story of all of God's previous efforts to save His people?
- How would you interpret this line in the second reading: "For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God"? How might this relate to our Baptism?
- What different behaviors might your baptismal promises impose on you? How might you live out your baptismal call during the next fifty days?

Activities

- In several cultures, a special blessing is prayed over the Easter foods that will be used at today's dinner.
- Mary Magdalene, Simon Peter, and John all reacted differently to the news of the resurrection. Reflect on your response to Christ's rising, and ask each member of your household to do the same as you sit down for Easter dinner.

• The Easter liturgy concluded with the solemn dismissal, "Thanks be to God, alleluia, alleluia!" Sing this phrase at home and throughout the day as you keep the octave of Easter.




Everything Changes

The Good News of Jesus Christ is precisely that things have changed and that they are going to change even more. He came to a world that was stuck, to a people that could not find a way out of their sinfulness, to announce that there was another way. Better yet, he came not simply to announce this path and carry us there as passive recipients of grace, but empowered his followers to bring about the kingdom of which he spoke. The kingdom of God is at hand. It is not simply a far distant reality, but something that is inbreaking here and now, something that can be felt and brought about by those who live in communion with him.

In the way we love one another, work for justice, and offer sacrifice—doing as Jesus did—we can actually make a difference in our world because it is in these moments that Christ dwells in us and the Holy Spirit is sent forth from us. What is it that we always pray? "Send down your Spirit and renew the face of the earth!" If we want to follow after Jesus, we must let go of our cynicism and bleak outlook on the world, and instead believe with all our hearts that Christ is in control of this mission. We must look beyond what is not yet redeemed and open our eyes to the overflowing torrent that is God's love in our world, transforming and renewing the face of the earth. We must realize it is through us, those whom Jesus has called as his disciples, that this work is being accomplished.
