John 21 reintroduces the Gospel through an epilogue. This later time and place by the Galilean sea alerts us that the story is not ended. Indeed, the journey of believing may never end as such. We follow Peter's lead, who last spoke thrice denying Jesus while warming himself by a charcoal fire with Jesus' enemies in the high priest's court. He had sworn to lay down his life for Jesus, but his defense was prevented in the garden. The earnest leader denied all relationship with Jesus. Now, he says, "I'm going fishing." Peter was to lead others to new life in community but has returned to his old life.



After a dark night, morning breaks to reveal Jesus ashore, guiding even actively failing disciples. The Beloved Disciple continues to witness and give access by recognizing the Lord. Peter, in keeping with his zealous character, jumps into the sea to get to Jesus. Reaching land, he returns on Jesus' command to haul the catch ashore in the unbroken net. The abundance echoes the wine and food Jesus provided (2:1-12; 6:1-14), representing the inclusivity of the Church.

Jesus meets the disciples around a new charcoal fire and meal. Reconciling Peter's relationship with Jesus takes center stage as Jesus confronts Peter repeatedly, upsetting his equilibrium and challenging him to decision and new action. Thrice inquiring about Peter's love, Jesus brings him into a binding relationship with missional consequences. Peter's leadership is clarified pastorally as he is mandated the new shepherd of the flock of the children of God, his journey culminating in the story even as it begins anew beyond the story's boundaries as Jesus commands, "Follow Me."

- Peter was going to take up his former life of fishing. When have you been tempted to return to a previous way of living?
- Jesus ultimately meets Peter where he is, in his imperfection. How is this a powerful lesson of hope for struggling believers of all time? Continued on Page 11

 John characterizes Peter as the leader and the Beloved Disciple as the model believer. How might we discern our gifts if the best leader may not be the best disciple, and vice versa?

Practice of Charity

John's Gospel shows the Lord feeding, forgiving, and inspiring his disciples to move on. Just as God does this for us, we are to do it for others.

- Invite someone who is struggling to a meal in your home. Offer your hospitality with no expectations and appreciate their presence.
- Journal about times when you have felt forgiveness as well as times in which you have forgiven others.

Questions

- Why is the power of Jesus Christ's Name so important? Where have you heard references to the Son's Name in the liturgy?
- When have you, in the midst of a crisis, cried out to the Lord to rescue you, as the psalmist in today's responsorial psalm apparently did? How close to the psalm was your own experience?
- As often seems to happen in post-resurrection encounters with Christ, the Apostles do not immediately recognize Him. How might we be failing to recognize Christ in our daily lives? How could we become more aware of him?

Activities

- This week, conduct an informal survey among your friends, asking under what circumstances they would choose to obey God rather than humans and why. Are their responses similar to your thoughts on this subject? How have their perspectives influenced you?
- A beautiful hymn is found in today's second reading from the Book of Revelation: "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain . . . forever and ever." Use this text this week as the basis for your prayer and join in the cosmic praise of the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.
- After reading this Gospel, read again the one proclaimed on Easter Sunday (John 20:1–9). Write in your journal or talk with a friend

about the different ways Peter and the Beloved Disciple behave in these two readings. What does each of them have to teach us about being a disciple of Christ?



Christ Calls Us to the Here and Now

Following Christ does not mean that we have to give up our jobs, schools, love of sports and entertainment, playing video games, or our social media handles. At least, not necessarily. What it means is that we need to let go of everything that produces anxiety in us and takes up our time without any benefit to ourselves or the world; it means giving up the trivial worries that merely keep us busy, give us something to think about, offer an escape, or hide us from what really matters. Christ calls us to the here and now. He wants us to be present to people and things that actually make a difference. If we want to be his disciples, there is no time to waste living in a world that doesn't exist. The kingdom is at hand, and it's the only world we need.


