Today's Gospel passage is situated within an event occurring in John 10:22—42. The verses just prior to today's Gospel note that the account occurs in the temple area on the Portico of Solomon in winter during the feast of Dedication (John 10:22—23), known today as Hanukkah. Jesus focuses first on His role as the Messiah then climaxes in His self-revelation as the Son of God. In this brief discourse, we learn it is not sufficient to hear the Shepherd's voice; true disciples follow it. The reward is life in union in this relationship.





We can never be snatched from God's hands. This life, however, begins with belonging to God here and now. It continues even as we pass from this world into God's eternal presence.

Solomon's portico, on the eastern face of the temple, is a fitting backdrop for this discourse occurring during the festival commemorating Judaism's resistance to blasphemy, idolatry, and apostasy. Speculation about Jesus' messiahship has been in the air for some time. Jesus intensifies the imagery of His relationship with God as Son to the Father. He draws His sheep to Him and, in so doing, presses far beyond both His interrogators' messianic expectations and comfort level by presenting His oneness with God.

"The Father and I are one" (10:30) articulates a familiar truth for us, but first-century Jewish people found it difficult. One teaching they understood unambiguously was that God is one (Deuteronomy 6:4). When Jesus spoke of "the Father and I," it seemed like two, but this is the stunning beauty of God's gift of Jesus to the world. The Son is indeed one with the Father in love and pastoral care for all who are open to their one voice.

- How do you see Jesus as caring for you in union with the Father and the Holy Spirit?
- In Acts, the apostles stand up to the powerful. How might you rise to such a challenge?

• John follows the psalmist in speaking of God's enduring mercy and faithfulness. Do you envision God and/or Christ as Shepherd? If so, how does this help? If not, how might it?

Practice of Hope

In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Paul and Barnabas allow God's Spirit to work through them as they preach to Jews and Gentiles in distant regions. Some Jewish leaders are jealous, however, and speak against the apostles. Paul and Barnabas remain true to their calling in the face of harassment. With perseverance, they spread the Lord's Word throughout the region.

- Take stock of your personal skills and talents and examine how you use them for God's glory. How can you seek to be a light to others?
- Consider embarking on a new hobby, activity, or endeavor that brings you enjoyment. Most likely, you are being inspired by our Creator to enhance the world with more of your gifts and energy.
- Meditate on the image of the Good Shepherd. Listen for God's voice.

Questions

- The first missionaries, Barnabas and Paul, worked to bring the joy of Christ to the communities they visited. What were some of the obstacles they encountered to bringing this joy? What kept them from being discouraged?
- Today's second reading describes a multitude that includes "every nation, race, people, and tongue"—a very "catholic" (meaning inclusive) vision. What can we do to make this vision a reality in our own parishes? How can we make every person feel invited?
- Have you ever taken offense to being referred to as a "sheep" obediently following a "shepherd"? On the other hand, how might this image of sheep and shepherd be consoling?
- On what occasions have you heard the shepherd's voice? What was your response? What does the statement "The Father and I are one" mean to you?



can we each take our part in spreading the light of Christ? Discern what gifts you have that could contribute to the mission. And as you're discerning, the spiritual "This Little Light of Mine" would be an appropriate song to add to your prayer this week. Sing: "Let it shine, let it shine, let it shine!"

• Consider adding more silence to your prayer life. When we allow for silence in our lives and in our liturgies, we are opening the door to the Holy Spirit to be the active, transforming agent at work in liturgy and in the world. Listen to the voice of the Shepherd and follow after Him.



Faith Is a Leap into God's Love

Faith is precisely nothing. It is nothing you can prove to be right, or use to get anywhere else. If you want something to believe in (which is where we all must start!), you had best be a totem and taboo Christian, with clear ground, identity, and boundaries. But that is not yet faith! That is merely securing the foundations for your personal diving board.

Faith is the leap into the water, now with the lived experience that there is One who can and will catch you—and lead you where you need to go! Religion, in some sense, is a necessary first half of life phenomenon. Faith is much more possible in the second half of life, not necessarily chronologically but always spiritually. As the Danish philosopher Søren Kierkegaard wisely said, "Life must be lived forward, but it can only be understood backward." Jonah knew what God was doing, and how God does it, and how right God is—only after emerging from the belly of the whale. He has no message whatsoever to give until he has first endured the journey, the darkness, the spitting up on the right shore—all in spite of his best efforts to avoid these very things. Jonah indeed is our Judeo-Christian symbol of transformation. Jesus had found the Jonah story inspiring, no doubt, because it described almost perfectly what was happening to him!
