This joyous Solemnity of Pentecost brings the Easter season to a conclusion. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells His disciples that His Father will send them the Holy Spirit, and we witness this promise brought to fulfillment in the reading from Acts. How is this Spirit manifested in Acts? It is noisy, powerful, fiery, and enabling. Those who received the Spirit were able to speak in different languages. Thus, "devout Jews from every nation under heaven" (2:5) who were staying in Jerusalem were able to understand what was proclaimed to them. This event has sometimes been understood as a reversal of the event

of the Tower of Babel, a time when people challenged God through their desire for power. As a result, God confused their language and scattered them over the earth.

The power of the first reading is reinforced in the refrain from the responsorial psalm: "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth." This hymn of praise recognizes God as creator of all and understands that without God's breath of life, we perish.

Paul's text from the Letter to the Romans also recognizes the power of God's life-giving Spirit. Paul reminds us that if we embrace this Spirit, if the Spirit dwells within us, we are children of God and heirs with Christ. Accepting such a gift has consequences. Like Christ, we will suffer, but we also will be glorified with him.

- Spend time in quiet with the words, "The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs." Let the words speak to you. Respond to God in prayer.
- Some patristic authors identified seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. Which of these gifts would you like to pray for today? How would this gift help you to be a better disciple?
- Pray the response from today's responsorial psalm. How do you envision God renewing the face of the earth?

Practice of Hope

Today we celebrate the birth of the Church. God fills us with the Holy Spirit so that we will participate in His Son's mission to bring everyone into His kingdom.

- Offer this prayer throughout the week: Come Holy Spirit, / fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. / Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. / And you shall renew the face of the earth. / O God, Who by the light of the Holy Spirit, / did instruct the hearts of the faithful, / grant that by the same Spirit / we may be truly wise and ever rejoice in His consolation, / through Christ our Lord. Amen.
- Consider becoming part of a liturgical ministry, or reflect on how you have grown through the ministry you already do.

- Enkindle hope in God's kingdom by volunteering in some way in your local community.

Questions

- Pentecost is a good time to reflect on how the Holy Spirit is working in your life. Can you picture yourself opening your heart to receive the Spirit as tongues of fire, as did the Virgin Mary and the apostles when they were gathered in the upper room?
- Another image for the Holy Spirit is captured in the Hebrew word *ruah*—the breath of the Holy Spirit. It fills the cosmos, all creation, and all living things. How do you detect its work in your life? Imbued with the Holy Spirit, what should we do to renew the face of the earth?
- How do the various gifts, ministries, and works spoken of in today's reading from 1 Corinthians serve to build up the Body of Christ?
- When we are sent from the liturgy on mission, it's important to set off in an attitude of humility, ready to empathize with our sisters and brothers. For example, how might we engage with the doubting Thomas?

Activities

- When you pray and talk with God, consider the language you use. Today's second reading uses "Abba, Father!" a very intimate way of conversing with God, meaning "Daddy" or "Papa." Do you tend to use formal names for God or more intimate ones? Start a list of names you might want to try in varying moods and circumstances.
- Jesus tells us in today's Gospel that if we love Him, we will keep His commandments. It's always good to return to the Ten Commandments now and then and use them for your examination of conscience. The Holy Spirit, the Advocate, was sent by God to help us discern the law in relation to our own lives. Try using them together, along with prayer.
- In the liturgy this weekend, we hear a special piece of music just before the Alleluia—the Sequence *Veni, Sancte Spiritus* (Come, O Holy Spirit, Come). Find its poetic text in English online or in the worship aid. Reflect on the beautiful imagery that celebrates the role of the Holy Spirit in salvation history.

- Examine the ways in which your understanding of the Eucharist is maturing. If you are finding a dry time in your life, locate a faith-sharing group or a spiritual companion to accompany you toward the Eucharist, which is the sacrament of our unity in Christ.
- Observing the divided Church on earth, may we turn toward the call of Jesus that all may be one. Pray for Christ's broken body as together we work for the unity of all Christians.

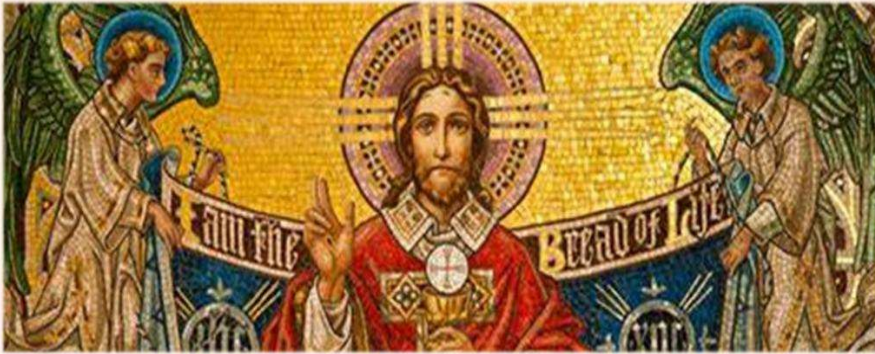

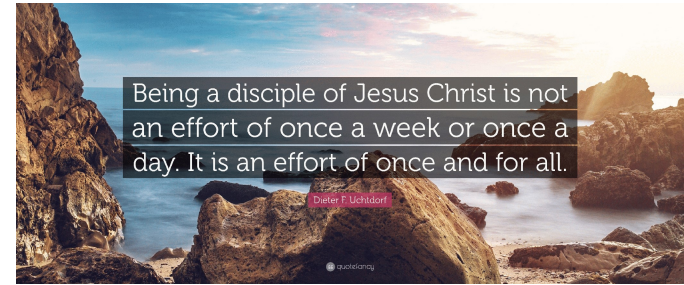

God of Spirit and Truth

“Open your eyes and see! The fields are shining for the harvest, the reaper can collect his wages now, the reaper can already bring in the grain of eternal life! The reaper and the sower can rejoice together” (John 4:35–36). You can hear Jesus’ excitement at the possibilities. Why? Partly because it is all happening now! The word already or now is used three times in the passage, and the phrase “sower and reaper together” conflates any notion of time between action and reward. The sowing is the reaping. You could also say that he is the reaper and she is the sower, and whatever is happening is happening right now. He has leapt beyond all boundaries of time, morality, and religion to announce a universal and gratuitous victory for God and for humanity that is taking place in the present tense! This really is great stuff, which could still reform Christian pettiness and division, or any notion of the Gospel as a reward/punishment system that comes after death.

“God of Spirit and Truth, expand my mind, but even more my heart to receive your great and universal good news. I know that no change of heart happens without a change of mind, and no change of mind happens without a change of heart. Get me started in one place or the other!”

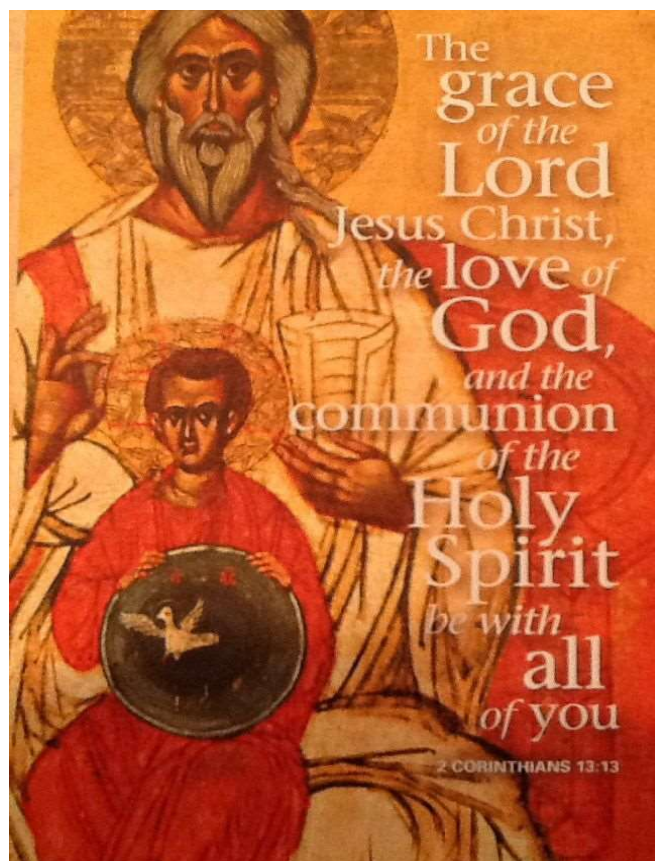
