

to Abram and then blesses him in the name of God Most High, has come to be recognized as one who prefigures Christ.

In our responsorial psalm, we find the second of three occurrences of Melchizedek in the Scriptures. Psalm 110, possibly composed for the coronation of the Davidic king, shows the giving of power from God and the granting of the status of the priest Melchizedek. (The third and final appearance of this figure is in chapters 5–7 of Hebrews.)

While First Corinthians offers a succinct account of the celebration of the Eucharist in the early Church, the Gospel from Luke

focuses attention on the multiplication of the five loaves and two fish. The Twelve are more than ready to dismiss the five thousand men (and most likely a great number of women and children) so that they and Jesus might have something to eat. After the Twelve follow Jesus' orders to have the people sit in groups of fifty, Jesus takes the loaves and fish, looks heavenward, blesses the food, and has the disciples distribute the food. Ihe entire crowd was satisfied, and an abundance of leftover food was collected. This Gospel reminds us that God nourishes us abundantly.

- Reflect on how the Eucharist nourishes you. How do you feed people who are hungry, both physically and spiritually?
- How does your local parish reach out to assist those who hunger and thirst?
- As you reread today's Gospel, reflect on the abundance that was collected from the crowd. What does this abundance suggest to you?

Practice of Hope

Today we celebrate all of the ways that God nourishes us in Christ. We also look ahead in hope to the fullness of God's kingdom when all people will have enough to eat and will sit together in eternal fellowship.

- Fast one day this week. Notice your hunger. What are all the ways God feeds you? For what are you still hungry? Do you fill yourself with the right food—spiritual as well as physical?
- Share a meal with your family and/or friends. Turn off the TV, your phone, etc. Try to keep the conversation on meaningful, enriching topics. Listen to how everyone is doing.
- Volunteer at a soup kitchen. Join some guests during the meal and listen to their stories.

Questions

- Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. How might this celebration be different from the way we focus on the Body and Blood of Christ every Sunday?
- What do you think is the significance of the priest Melchizedek in today's first reading? What might be the correlation between Christ's priesthood and that of Melchizedek?

• What seems particularly significant to you in the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes? Can you identify some of the ritual gestures in today's Gospel, in the Last Supper, and in the story of Christ at table in Emmaus?

Activities

- On June 24, the Church celebrates the Nativity of St. John the Baptist. The only other births that the Church observes are those of Mary and Christ. Consider how John the Baptist pointed to Christ and how you can do that in your life.
- Pray this week for Native Americans, the First Nations peoples, and remember Chief Seattle, who became a Catholic in 1830 and lived in a way that earned him respect from both the native peoples and the new settlers.
- Consider spending some time in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament this week. One focus of your prayer might be on communities without a resident priest where the Eucharist is celebrated only occasionally.

God loves us so much that, not only did he make us a creation unto ourselves, but in doing so, he gifted us with a particular way to return that love that is fit for no other person. In simply being our true selves, doing nothing more than becoming the unique person that God created us to be, we give glory to God and follow our own particular path of holiness. That's it! We are not to imitate the lives of the saints or do what others define for us; our path to holiness is not made by scrupulously following the path of a holy person who has gone before us. What is asked of me may not be asked of you. What you are capable of may not be what I am capable of. Each and every one of us has been created differently, for God's own glory, and we each have our own path to follow.


