Today's reading from the First Book of Kings is a small portion of one of the best-known chapters of this book. Today's selection, however, is better understood within its context. Several verses earlier, Elijah, fearful for his life, takes refuge in a cave of Mount Horeb (another name for Sinai). Immediately prior to this, the notorious Queen Jezebel had threatened to have Elijah killed because he was responsible for the death of the prophets of the foreign god, Baal, whom Jezebel worshiped (1 Kings 19:2).

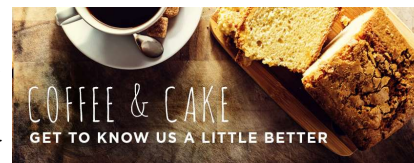

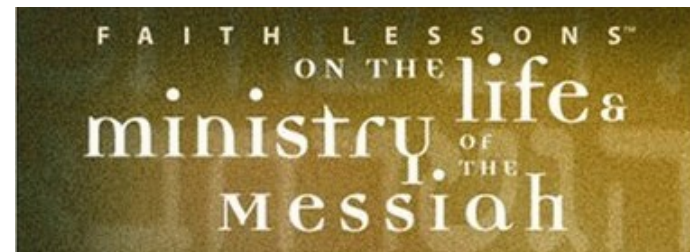

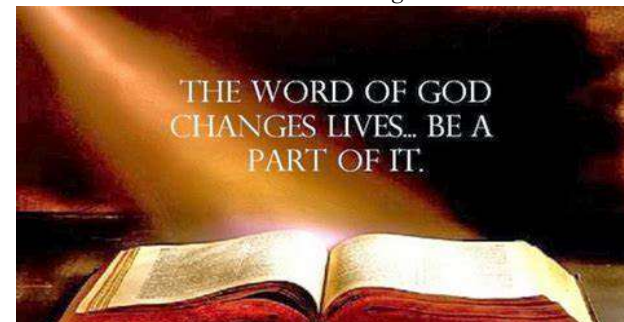

According to 1 Kings 18:22, these prophets numbered 450. In that verse, Elijah claims himself as "the only remaining prophet of the LORD." Thus, in today's reading, we find Elijah throwing his cloak over Elisha, who will eventually succeed Elijah. By slaughtering the oxen that he had used for plowing, Elisha confirms that he is changing the direction of his life. Elisha will attend to Elijah until the time that Elisha succeeds the prophet. The passage in 2 Kings 2:9—12 recounts the succession event.

The Gospel from Luke begins the story of Jesus' journey to Jerusalem, which concludes in chapter 19. Today's twelve verses are quite packed. The first portion of the text makes it clear that Jesus and His disciples were not welcome in the Samaritan village where they had stopped. Hostility between the Jews and Samaritans was long-standing and had existed for hundreds of years. In the second portion of the Gospel are three brief encounters. In the first encounter, an individual offers to follow Jesus anywhere; in the second and third encounters, Jesus invites people to follow Him. In each case, the individual is unable to accept the demands of discipleship.

- Reread today's passage from First Kings and reflect on how Elisha received his call to be a prophet.
- In today's Gospel, what kinds of demands does discipleship make?
- What similarities do you find between the reading from First Kings and the Gospel? What is the cost of responding to God's invitation?

Practice of Charity

Following Christ requires total commitment. The longer the commitment is delayed, the harder it becomes to learn how to be a good disciple and the less likely the individual is to follow Jesus at all. James and John certainly had much to learn about discipleship!

- Whom do you find difficult to love? Imagine Jesus sitting beside you. How would you talk to each other about this difficulty?
- Do you know someone who is in the seminary or entering religious life? Send that person a note of support and pray for him or her throughout the week.
- Reflect on Galatians 5:13-26 (an extension of the second reading). In what ways have you welcomed the Spirit into your life? In what ways are you still enslaved to things that are harmful or even evil?

Questions

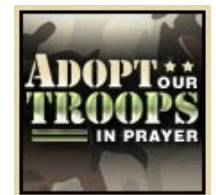
- How does the reading from 1 Kings show that Elisha was truly the spiritual heir of Elijah? How are we listening for our call in the midst of busy daily tasks?
- How has the yoke of slavery (second reading) been lifted from our shoulders? What are some ways in which you are placing yourself at another's service?
- In what ways are you accompanying Jesus on the journey to Jerusalem? What are some of the roads that you are traveling as you march toward the heavenly Jerusalem?

Activities

- Explore ways in which you might put your faith into action. Pray as a family—the domestic church—and enter into some activities that flow from your prayer.
- Today is Word of God Sunday For Polish National Catholics. Our Church regards the Word of God, proclaimed and heard, to be a sacrament. Pray for all those who listen as the scriptures are proclaimed, that God's Word may find in them a fruitful field and that lectors and clergy who proclaim the Word may do so with a deep faith and confident voice.
- The Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul is on Wednesday, June 29. These men came from different backgrounds and had different conversion stories but worked together for the good of the Church. Think of someone whose ideas are much different than yours but who shares a common goal with you. Determine ways that you can work harmoniously with that person.

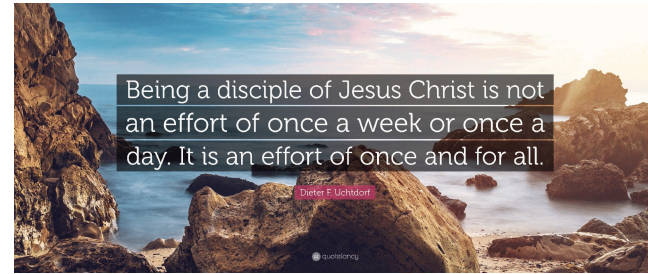
