Today's reading from Isaiah is from the very last chapter of this monumental prophetic book. In some respects, the last two chapters of Isaiah might be considered a grand finale to a work that spans an extensive period of Israel's relationship with God. passage, addressed to the post-exilic community, offers hope to the people who did not see God's promises made to the exiles as coming to fulfillment. The message to this community is: "Rejoice!" God will comfort you, and you will know the Lord's saving power.

The responsorial psalm reinforces the message in Isaiah, as the

psalmist invites the assembly to sing God's praises. The psalm moves between worshiping God and recalling the saving deeds that God has performed on behalf of his people.

In the concluding verses of Paul's Letter to the Galatians, we hear that Paul takes pride in his commitment to the cross of the Lord Jesus Christ. Paul, who had been a persecutor of the followers of Jesus, now proclaims that the only important thing in life is to become a new creation in Christ.

The Gospel passage from Luke provides us with some idea of the urgency of the disciples' mission. Nowhere else in the Gospels do we hear of this group of seventy-two followers of Jesus. Elsewhere, the Scriptures identify the twelve. This increase in the number of those preaching the news of the kingdom might be understood as a foreshadowing of what will take place in the years to come.

In some way, all of today's readings speak of a people who know that they are of God. While the cost of discipleship is high, the people of God can only rejoice in what the Lord has done for them.

- Reread the text from Isaiah. Where in your life do you need comfort? Quietly stay with an image of God consoling you.
- St. Paul speaks boldly about his commitment to the good news of Jesus Christ. How do you live your commitment to the Gospel?
- In today's Gospel, the disciples of Jesus are given their instructions for ministry. What directives do you think Jesus would give to you today?

**Practice of Hope**

These readings fill us with hope. Jesus shares His power to cast out evil in all its forms. St. Paul participates in this life-saving power and bravely overcomes the hardship it brings. Isaiah's prophecy inspires us to strive for that kingdom in which God's love consoles, nurtures, and protects us forever.

- Imagine that you are one of the disciples Jesus sent out. What do you say and do? What challenges do you meet? What further help do you need from the Lord?
- Missionary work is often called the propagation of the faith. Learn more about how your local parish or diocese supports the propagation of the faith. How can you also support this work?
- Read about St. Francis Xavier, the patron saint of missionaries. Ask for his intercession on behalf of those striving throughout the world to share Christ's love with new people.

**Questions**


- How do you recognize the motherly kindness of God in today's first reading? Can you identify some other stories in Scripture that reflect motherly images of God?
- In what ways are you embracing the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, as St. Paul does in the Second Reading? How are you accepting the gifts of peace and mercy as you embrace the Cross of Christ?
- After reading today's Gospel, consider: who do you identify as your spiritual companion as you bear the Good News to all the nations? What role are you taking in encouraging others to share in the harvest and embrace the evangelizing ministry of Jesus?

**Activities**

- Reflect on the words from today's Gospel, "peace to this household." Consider the motto of Benedictine hospitality, which says, "all are to be welcomed as Christ." Greet all who cross the threshold of your home with the words, "peace," "shalom," "paz," or "pax."
- Take an imaginary trip to visit a friend in another town, taking no money, luggage, or shoes. Write in your journal about what this might be like and the effect it could have on your spiritual life.
- Pray this week for all domestic workers; those who clean hotel rooms, housekeepers, and janitorial personnel. Next time you stay in a motel or hotel, consider leaving a more generous tip than usual for the person who cleans your room.



### **Breathing with God**

The gift of the Holy Spirit—whom Jesus called the “promise of the Father”—was given to the apostles at Pentecost. And in the miraculous events that accompanied the sending of the Holy Spirit, it became quite clear that the saving action of God would compellingly move forward. Those present in the Upper Room were recreated according to the order of grace to share the life of God, who is love. They were able to, as it were, “breathe with God.” This love poured into their hearts by the Holy Spirit is no mere human sentiment but the indwelling presence of the divine. It courses through them as gently and imperceptibly as the air they breathe. The Holy Spirit is the unseen power that fuels the ministry and activity of the apostles and gives them the courage to speak in Jesus’ name.
