In the reading from the Book of Deuteronomy, Moses instructs the people about the law. The law that is referred to is far from what most people would consider upon hearing the word law. In the Old Testament, the word law, which appears most often in the Book of Psalms and the Book of Deuteronomy, is understood as "instruction" or "teaching" and was intended to be a guide for living life well. Thus, we hear the psalmist extol the blessings of the law throughout Psalm 119, the lengthiest of all psalms. Moses wants the people to understand that God's law is within them and that they need only to

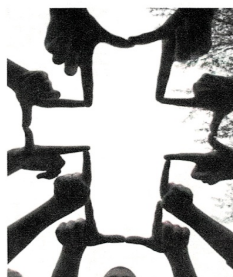

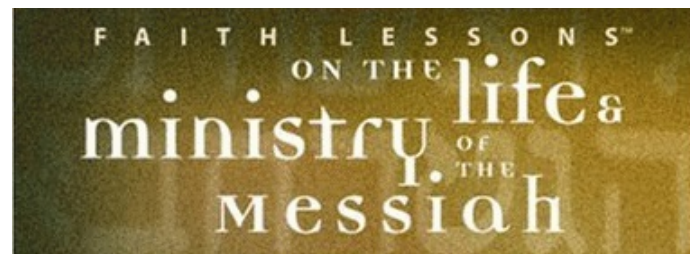

recognize it and live it.

Luke's Gospel also turns our attention to the law when the so-called "scholar of the law" asks Jesus about inheriting eternal life. When Jesus questions him about what is written in the law, the scholar refers to teachings found in Deuteronomy (see 6:5) and Leviticus (see 19:9—18). When the scholar questions Jesus further, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus tells the parable of the Good Samaritan, a story that exemplifies the selfless love of a true neighbor. In today's Gospel, it can be noted readily that knowing the "right answer" does not equate with understanding the Scriptures.

- When have you put yourself at risk to help someone, as does the Good Samaritan? If there were repercussions, were you still glad that you showed mercy?
- The reading from Deuteronomy concludes with Moses stating that God's law is "something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out." Jesus' response to the scholar is "You have answered correctly; do this and you will live." How are these statements similar? What do these words tell you about a life that is faithful to God?
- The author of the Letter to the Colossians extols Christ Jesus as "the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation." Is it difficult for you to understand that Jesus is both human and divine?

Practice of Charity

Jesus urges us to treat everyone as our neighbor, whether we know them or not. As we hear in the hymn from Colossians, all are connected to one another and to creation itself through Christ, in whom "all things hold together."

- Imagine traveling that road to Jericho. What would have kept you from helping the person who had been attacked? What would have motivated you to help?
- Sponsor an evening of dialogue about racism. If possible, invite people of different backgrounds to share their stories.
- Consider new ways to care for God's creation.

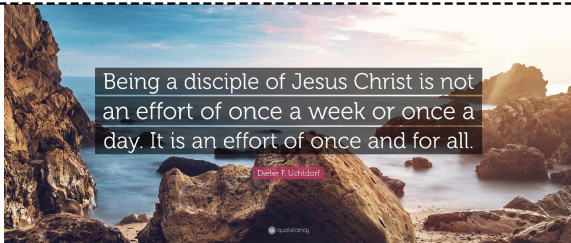
- How do Moses' words spur you to conform your life to the law and the commandments? Do they indeed seem simple and near

- to you? If not, how could you bring them closer?
- In today's beautiful poetic second reading, we learn many things about Christ Jesus. Was any of this new or surprising to you, causing you to revise your idea of Christ? How do you interpret "in him all the fullness was pleased to dwell"? What could that mean?
- The basic question in today's Gospel is "who is my neighbor?" How do you answer this question? And who are some of the good Samaritans of our day? As you travel down the road of life, who are you encountering that is in need of your help?

Activities

- With a friend or within your household, read today's second reading as a choral reading. Divide up the parts, alternating voices often, and read through it several times, experimenting with different intonations. See what insights emerge.
- Today's Gospel asks the question, "who is my neighbor?" Consider getting to know your neighbors. If you are out for a summer walk, stop for a moment, introduce yourself, and enter into a hospitable conversation.
- After hearing the story of the good Samaritan in today's Gospel, support any charities that come to mind. Pray for those in the healthcare profession: doctors, nurses, aids, therapists, administrators, and pastoral care providers. See if you can be a good Samaritan for someone this week.
