The reading from Genesis is a continuation of last week's first reading, with fewer than ten verses omitted from the story. Because of the missing verses, we do not hear that while Abraham accompanied his visitors on their way toward Sodom, God was deliberating whether to inform Abraham of the plan to destroy that city. Once the Lord has spoken to Abraham about this, Abraham engages the Lord in a conversation about the justice of the plan. God had heard the pleas of innocent people who had been oppressed by the Sodomites and had determined to destroy the city. It was Abraham who spoke up on

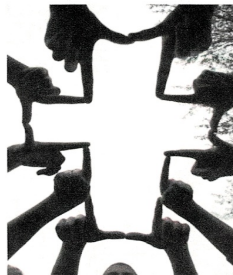

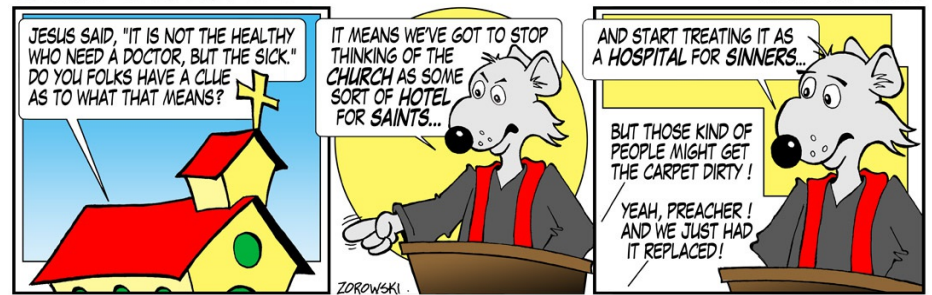

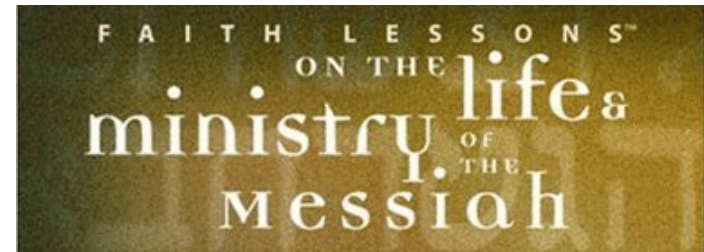

behalf of the innocent and questioned God's design to kill them along with the guilty. Abraham reveals himself to be a just man who calls God's ways into question.

The Responsorial refrain from Psalm 138 is a lovely expression of gratitude. The psalmist recalls praying to God when in a situation of need and God's response. As a result of God's compassion, the psalmist expresses gratitude and praise, a fitting response to the gift of God's love.

Today's Gospel on prayer contains material for a great deal of reflection. It begins with Luke's version of the Our Father, which is slightly different from the better-known prayer in Matthew. Two examples follow the prayer; one represents the importance of persistence in prayer and the other that God hears our prayer.

- In the Gospel, a disciple requests that Jesus teach the disciples how to pray. Have you ever asked a spiritual mentor to help you pray?
- Consider how the readings from Genesis and the Gospel both depict individuals who freely approach God. Abraham reasons with God because he does not think that the decision to kill all the people of Sodom is just, while the disciple approaches Jesus because he wants to learn from Jesus.
- Can you speak freely to God when you are in need?

***Practice of Faith***

God does not want merely to be believed in but to be in relationship with us. God wants to console and uplift us, to guide and challenge us. God reveals himself to us and awaits our response.

- There are countless ways we can accept God's invitation and strengthen our relationship with Him. Consider learning a new way to pray. Try praying with your body by lifting up your hands, bowing, or kneeling.
- Read more about the Lord's Prayer. A discussion of the prayer can be found in the Polish National Catholic Church Catechism.
- Participate in an opportunity for communal prayer such as the Rosary or Morning Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours. The Divine Office is said before Holy Mass Monday through Saturday in our cathedral parish. Find a time to come to Holy Mass and pray with the faithful present.

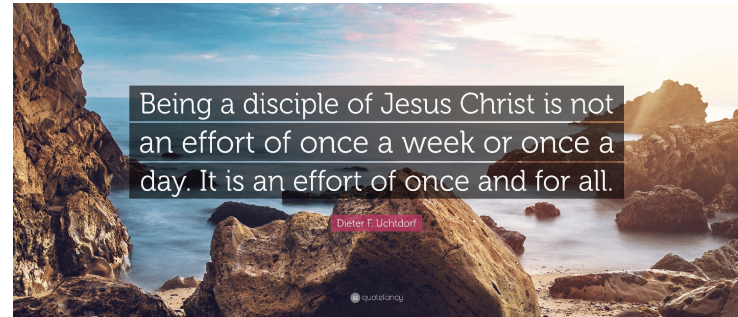


Questions

- What in the first reading seems surprising to you about the way Abraham talks with God? What insights do you take from the reading about your own communication with God?
- In what ways do we disciples participate in the mystery of the death and resurrection of Christ? What does it mean to you to be entombed with Christ in order to rise with him?
- Does it seem surprising that the apostles ask “Lord, teach us to pray”? What do you think seemed notable to them about the way Jesus was praying that they wanted to emulate? The disciples address God as “Abba” (Father); a name that is both familiar and respectful. What are some familiar and respectful names you give God?

- Read today’s responsorial psalm aloud. Write in your journal or talk to a trusted friend about how this prayer affects you, including any memories it might stir.
- Consider exploring the way of *lectio divina* and centering prayer by visiting [www.centeringprayer.com/lectio\\_divina.html](http://www.centeringprayer.com/lectio_divina.html). Discover ways in which you can enter into a more intimate conversation with God so that your faith may be strengthened.
- Find a beautifully rendered copy of the Lord’s Prayer that you can frame and put it in a prominent place in your home.



Connected to the Earth

When you see yourself as a part of the greater whole, you not only give greater honor to the whole, but you also gain a healthy perspective on your own significance. This is just one of the many gifts that Creation has to offer us. Growing a garden, taking meditative hikes, and increasing your environmental stewardship are all ways you can find your place within the whole. Getting your body, soul, and mind in tune with the natural world can have significant benefits to your quality of life. You are not an isolated creature, not a mere accident tasked with going through life on your own. Your physical body is an integral and natural part of the planet you are on—one where your actions, attitudes, and even your thoughts impact the whole.

Stepping out into nature can remind you that you are not the center of the world. In relation to both the splendor and suffering of the earth, the way you feel about your physical appearance truly is a very small thing. You are part of something so much bigger—something so much better than the number on the tag of your pants. Animals delight in their life without ever considering their shape or size. Plants do their work of photosynthesis without self-consciousness. Spending time in Creation—and finding your interconnectedness to it—invites you to stop taking yourself so seriously. Step outside and let nature heal you. Appreciate the way your body connects you to the primal longing to belong— and belong here, you do.

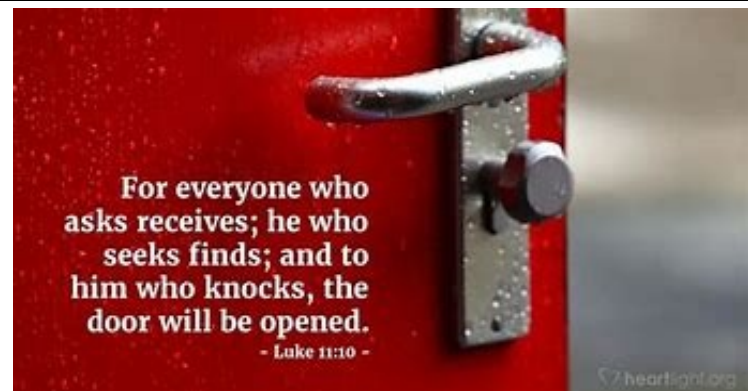

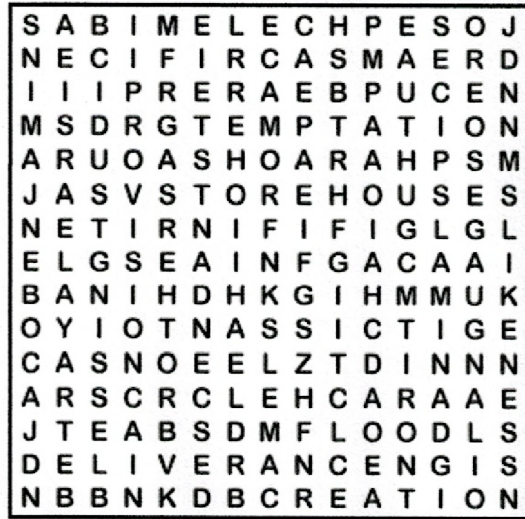
