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Scripture Insights

There's a small tension between two truths in the reading from Sirach. On the one hand, God does not play favorites; He welcomes home anyone who turns to Him, with no exceptions. At the same time, God is especially inclined to protect the vulnerable and the oppressed. In the first reading and the psalm, God hears with special favor the cries of two groups of people: the willing servants of God, or the just, and the lowly or brokenhearted.

The two groups are so closely associated that they sometimes even seem to be the same. Those who are crushed in spirit are those

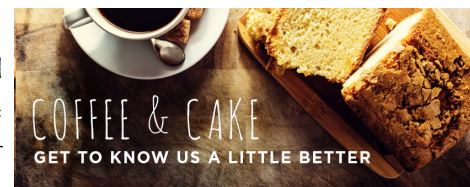

SOUP FOR SENIORS

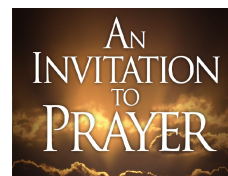

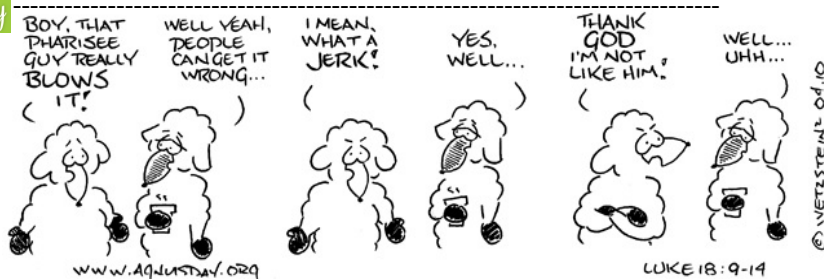

who humble themselves before God and serve him; the proud and puffed up turn away from God and oppress the poor, earning God's anger.

In the Gospel reading, the tax collector (a despised member of

society) is one of the lowly. He humbles himself before God, asking only for mercy. His prayer, as Sirach says, "pierces the clouds" (Sirach 35:20); God hears and justifies him. The Pharisee represents the opposite: a proud man who cannot see his need for God's help and despises people like the tax collector. He does not ask for mercy, so God does not give it.

In the second reading, we find Paul meditating on the end of his life and a race well run. He thinks of the reward he will receive, but unlike the Pharisee he does not boast of his achievements or look down on others. God's appearance is the only award he awaits. God himself, the just judge, is the reward of the faithful and the only prize Paul desires.

- Why does God hear with special favor the cries of the oppressed and brokenhearted?
- Are there people in our society today who represent the Pharisees and the tax collectors?
- At the end of your life, what would it mean to be able to say, like Paul, that you have competed well and kept the faith?

Practice of Hope

It's amusing to see the Pharisee present God with his moral resumé, as if God is not aware already of our every action and thought. Worse than his arrogance, however, is the Pharisee's contempt for his brother in faith, the tax collector. How often do we sit at Mass and view members of our faith family with judgment or even scorn? Better for us to take the measure of our sinfulness and avoid a preoccupation with anyone else's.

- Read Matthew 5:3—12 for a list of qualities Jesus says are required of a child of God.
- Prayerfully conduct an examination of conscience and ask God for mercy.
- After Mass, introduce yourself to someone you see every Sunday but don't know.

Questions

- According to the first reading from Sirach, what are the qualities that best enable a person to be heard by God?
- What connections can you make to the paschal mystery when

you hear the closing words of today's Letter to Timothy: "I am already being poured out like a libation"? Do Paul's words, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith," express the attitude of "mission accomplished" or "it is finished"?

- How would you name the Pharisee's problem? How comfortable are we with the tax collector's prayer? How do we wear the label "sinner"?

Activities

- After reading today's first reading, pray Mary's beautiful prayer, the Magnificat (Luke 1:46-55). What images and themes do the two passages share?
- Write in a journal or talk with a friend about today's second reading. What clues does this reading give you about Paul's personality and about the qualities of his faith?
- St. Andrew Legal Clinic in Portland, Oregon, provides free and low-cost legal assistance to low-income people and those who otherwise would not have access to legal representation. Ask some Catholic lawyers in your area to consider taking on more *pro bono* work on behalf of the poor.

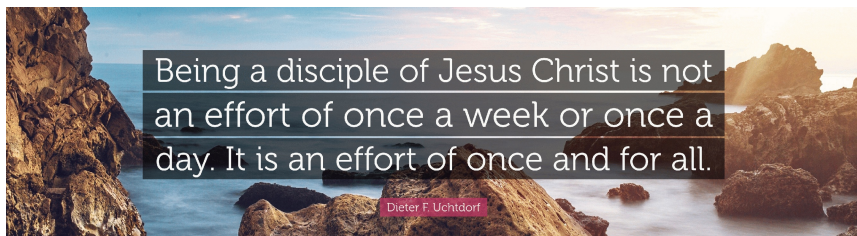

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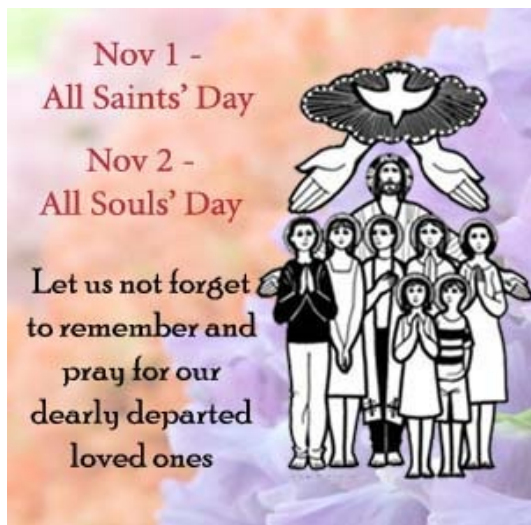


The Great Reconciler

I believe that Jesus is the great reconciler. Picture two lines, one going vertically, the other going horizontally: That's the cross. Pioneer psychologist Carl Jung stated that Jesus was killed in an "agonizing suspension between irreconcilable opposites." Whenever we try to hold opposite energies together—liberal/conservative, masculine/feminine, right/wrong, black/white, anything that's conflictive—we are going to get crucified.

When viewing the cross, picture a collision of opposites, the coming together of opposing energies, both of which invariably think they're the whole truth. Paul saw this clearly, thirty years after Jesus died: "God wanted all fullness to be found in him and through him to reconcile all things to him, everything in heaven and everything on earth, by making peace through his death on the cross" (Colossians 1:19–20).

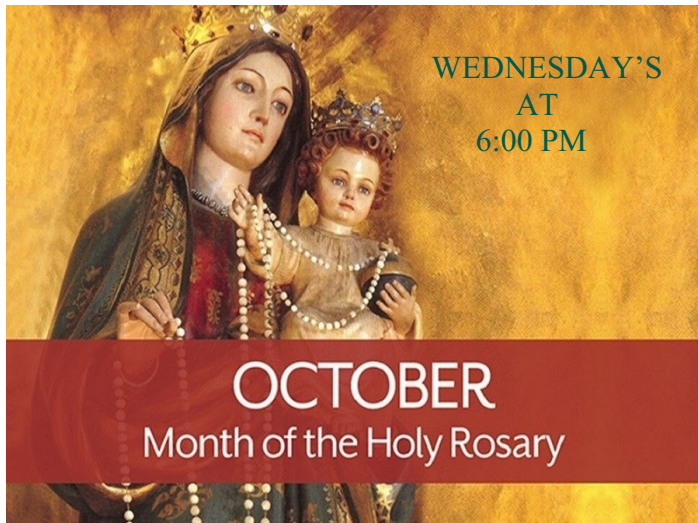

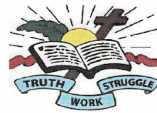
