In the first reading, Saul (the first king of Israel) is dead, but the house of Saul and the house of David are still at war with one another. Then all the tribes of Israel come to David to acknowledge that he is the one whom God chose to shepherd Israel. David accepts the mantle of leadership and is anointed as their king.

The psalm for today is a "psalm of ascents," a joyful song intended to be sung by pilgrims as they ascended the hill toward Jerusalem and the temple. It is a psalm of David, who ends the psalm by praying for the peace of the city.

SOUP FOR SENIORS

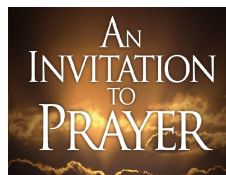

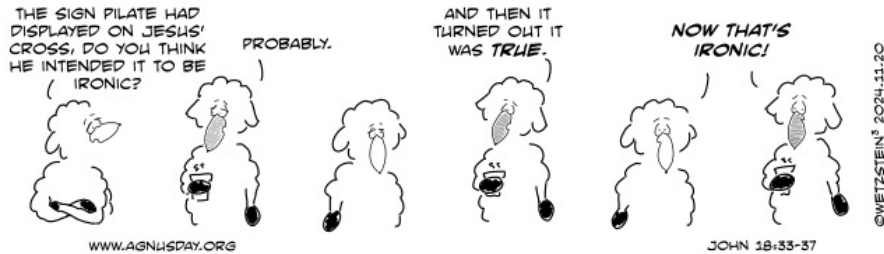

In the Gospel reading, we find a descendant of David and a very different kind of king being executed in the city of Jerusalem. On the cross where Jesus hangs awaiting His coming death, the Romans have put a sign: "This is the King of the Jews." To the Romans, this is the charge leveled against Jesus and the reason for His execution; He has declared Himself to be a king, challenging the authority of Caesar. To the bystanders, it is cause for mockery: how could this dying criminal be the king of his people? But to Luke, it is the truth. Jesus is the true king who has the power to welcome the repentant rebel being crucified with Him into His kingdom of everlasting life.

The reading from Colossians reveals Jesus' true identity; not only is he king over Israel, He is "the image of the invisible God" (1:15) and the ruler over all creation. God chose weakness and apparent failure to heal everything that had been broken at the Fall; through Jesus' death on the cross, God reconciles all things, bringing them back into restored relationship with the Creator.

- How is Jesus a king like David? How is He a king unlike David?
- If Jesus could have saved Himself from the cross, why didn't He?
- Look for all the qualities ascribed to Christ the Son in the reading from Colossians, and meditate on what this says about who Christ is for us today.

Practice of Hope

There is nothing more comforting than the authority with which Jesus declares, "Today you will be with me in Paradise." We live in hope that the same will be said about us when we die. Meanwhile, how are we to live so that we will be ready when our end comes? Even the most notorious sinner has the hope of salvation through sincere repentance, no matter how delayed.

- Read about St. Dismas, traditionally considered to be the criminal who asked Jesus to remember him.

- Read about St. Dismas, traditionally considered to be the criminal who asked Jesus to remember him.
- Pray for the intercession of St. Dismas, "the good thief," for his clear faith and humility.
- Go to Prison Fellowship Angel Tree (prisonfellowship.org) to find ways to give hope to prisoners.

Questions

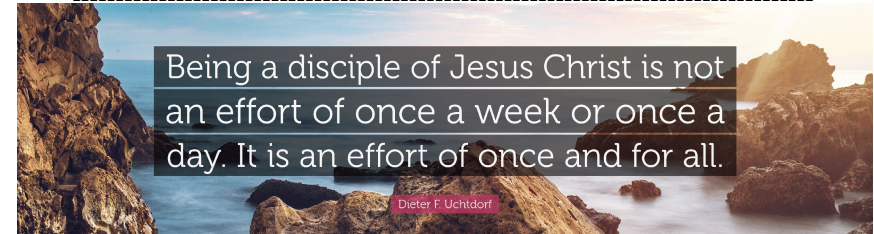
- It can be helpful to think of the Sunday readings as a triptych, with the chief panel being the Gospel and the first and second readings not quite on the same level but slightly turned toward it. Try moving from one panel to the other, back and forth. How does this illuminate the richness of the whole?
- As you study the beautiful hymn quoted in the second reading, the poetic meditation on all that Christ is, do you discover new insights about the Lord?
- Considering the scene painted in today's Gospel, if you were hanging on a cross next to Jesus, what would you say to him? How do you understand the "good criminal's" request, "Jesus, remember me"?

Family Activities

- Prepare for Advent by deciding this week how you will keep the season. The booklet Keeping Advent and Christmastime (Liturgy Training Publications) provides blessings for the Advent wreath, a listing of the "O" antiphons, and suggestions for observing the season.
- In your imagination, take a position at the foot of the cross as a watcher. Let your "watching" be contemplation. One of the criminals hanging next to Jesus said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Find on the internet the ostinato refrain with these same words that comes from the Taizé community, in France. Add this simple chant to your daily prayer.
- Looking in art books or on the internet, explore the various images of the glorious cross found in Christian art and iconography. Find an image that speaks to you and use it for contemplation.

A Prayer of Thanksgiving

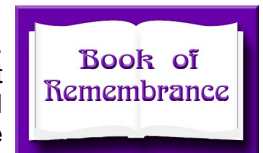

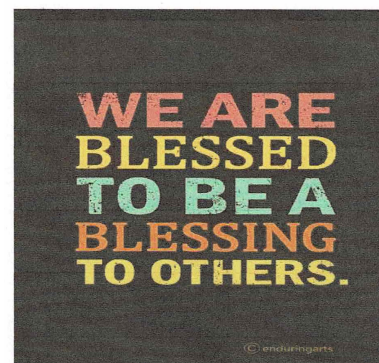

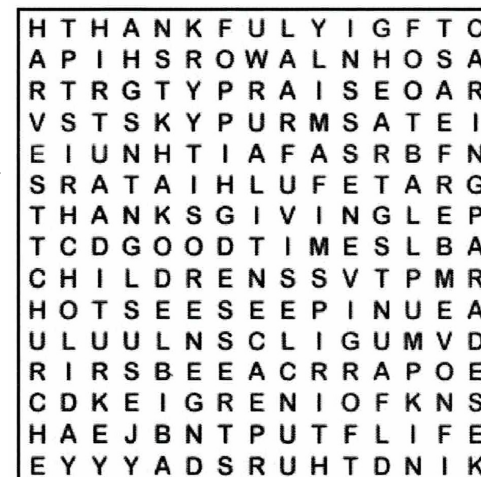
