Scripture Insights

Birthing a child is an act of hope and an embrace of possibility. It takes incredible courage. We might call it an act of faith. In a time of national and political crisis, Judah's king Ahaz was having a crisis of faith (Is 7:2). Isaiah offered him a sign of assurance that God would protect his people from invasion. The king pretended it was a virtue to say no—surely it would be wrong to test God. But God wanted to confirm the divine promises. God chose to do so through the birth of a child. The woman's faithful labor births a future in which God's saving presence is abundantly manifest.

There was no soup for seniors the past Sunday. We expect that it will resume again this week.


The Soup for Seniors Program is sponsored by our HTC Frederick Chopin Choir. We hope our seniors are benefitting from the Choir Members' efforts.



Mary's faithful labor would do the same. Even as the Gospel reading focuses on Joseph's change of heart, it also reveals the risks Mary assumed in order to bring about God's plan of salvation. She risked divorce, public shame, poverty, and other challenges of single motherhood. Her courage summoned a corresponding act of faith from Joseph, who reaffirmed his commitment to her and raised as his own a child conceived through the power of the Holy Spirit.

By identifying the infant Jesus as the sign-child Emmanuel, Matthew underscored Jesus' character as royal Messiah. Psalm 24 celebrates God's royal character and the act of entry into God's sacred temple. It also describes the conditions that make it possible for the faithful to enter and worship there. Examining our actions, intentions, and desires is an important way we prepare to encounter God in sacred liturgy.

St. Paul emphasizes that our obedience does not come about solely through our own efforts. We can only be obedient through our cooperation with the gift of God's grace. His letter to the Romans here confesses Christ's humanity and divinity. Jesus' birth sanctifies our humanness, calling us to greater holiness through our participation in and belonging to Christ.

- What does it mean to seek God's face in worship?
- What are other examples of signs from God in the Scriptures? What did they signify?
- How have you experienced God's grace this week? How have you answered the call to belong to Jesus Christ?

Practice of Hope

How do we approach God with a pure heart amid the chaos of this busy pre-Christmas season? Joseph teaches us to focus on what

truly matters. He obeyed the message from the angel and took Mary as his wife.

- How can you better prepare for Christ's second coming? Spend time in quiet prayer this week and allow the Holy Spirit to counsel you.
- Joseph gave the gift of family to Mary and Jesus by welcoming them into his home. Beyond gifts, how can you show hospitality to someone having difficulty?
- Joseph also serves as a model of trust in God. Spend time in prayer asking God for the grace to trust in his promises. If you are having difficulty trusting in God and are experiencing doubts about your faith, make the effort to address your doubts in prayer and spiritual direction.

Questions

- Isaiah tells the people of Israel that they are wearying God. What do you think this means? What might be the genuine reason Ahaz is hesitant to ask for a sign, even though God is instructing him to do so?
- The passage from Paul is the introduction to his remarkable Letter to the Romans. Why do you think Paul offers so much vivid description? What is he trying to convey to his readers and to us today?
- The angel of the Lord comes to Joseph in his dream. In doing so, the angel reassures him about the identity of this unborn child. Joseph, upon awakening, has a change of heart. Have you ever had a dramatic turnaround in point of view due to a dream, prayer, or reflective moment?

Activities

- Write in your journal or talk with your group about the significance of the birth of a child in human life. What promise and possibility does this life event offer to couples, families, and communities? Notice if there are any new births around you, literal or figurative.
- When angels appear in the Scripture, they usually begin by saying "fear not" or "do not be afraid." Is there a place of fear in your life right now? Are there any reassuring "angels" around you? Write about these thoughts in your journal.

- Joseph is transformed and takes an action that is the antithesis of his original plan. How do you think those around him reacted to this change of heart? Can you think of people you know who have done the right thing despite social or community pressure? Pray for a man in your life who is in need of the courage and wisdom of Joseph.



Filled with God's Grace

Mary knew who she was to the very depth of her being. She said "yes" to God and because of that, the world was turned upside down, or perhaps was finally righted. Mary's "yes" her testimony to the way God intended the world to be from the beginning. Because she said yes, a new creation would be revealed to the world. This woman at the heart of the Advent season is a remarkable role model for us. We might not realize it, but we, too, are filled with God's grace, even if that grace is clouded and obscured by sin. Mary may have been born knowing who she was, but we are given many opportunities to learn the marvelous truth that we are sons and daughters of God. At times, we mistake humility for inferiority, but in truth humility means knowing who we are, with all our strengths and weaknesses, gifts and gaps. Our job is to

clear away those things that keep us from saying yes to God. If we focus only on what's missing, we miss the beauty that's already there. As we become more and more clear, we better reflect and magnify the Lord who has given us all that we have, made us all that we are (and can be). And here, too, we can learn from Mary. Again and again, the Gospels tell us that she treasured everything in her heart, pondering the meaning of the angel's words—and later those of her precocious child. She must have spent long days and even sleepless nights wondering where his adult path would lead him. But through all of ponderings, she knew in her heart that she could trust the God to whom she had said yes. How do you show forth the glory of God to those around you? Pray these words with Mary: My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior. (Luke 1:46-47) We'll never be asked to do what Mary did. Her role in salvation history was unique. But God asks us to have her openness to those things that we are called to do. Take some time even in this hectic week to reflect on your life—past, present, and future—and listen for how God is asking you to make things right in your little corner of the world.


