Scripture Insights

John the Baptist's ministry was a preparation for that of Jesus' impending one. By preaching repentance and baptizing believers, John prepared people to receive Jesus' radical proclamation and Spirit-filled ministry. Elsewhere in Scripture, the desert or wilderness is a place of testing and refining that emphasizes God's miraculous and transformative power.

In this space of testing, St. Paul highlights gifts of endurance and encouragement. Earlier in Romans, he traced a chain of growth from suffering to endurance to character to hope (Rom 5:3–5). That

SOUP FOR SENIORS



hope is grounded in God's love, truthfulness, and promises (Rom. 5:5, 15:8). The gift of encouragement is not just for oneself but for the strengthening of others (Rom 12:6–8). Today, he reminds his readers that Scripture can equip them to bear with and lift one another up in difficult times.

The psalm and first reading each portray a righteous ruler. The psalm asks God to make justice the defining feature of the king's rule. It is not a vague concept; it takes concrete shape in policies that advance and protect the well-being of society's most vulnerable. By championing the cause of those who are poor and in need, the just ruler enacts God's judgment for the world.

In the first reading, the just ruler receives God's own spirit. The same spirit of knowledge guiding the king helps transform every facet of society and every pocket of creation. Isaiah's vision of a radically transformed future has inspired people to imagine the change that is possible for our world. Together, these readings show us the scope of that change. Jesus' coming is not just a personal matter. It touches all of creation.

- What Old Testament reading do you think offered Paul's readers encouragement and strength for endurance and why?
- Why does God value justice for the poor?
- What can you clear away to make space for the Holy Spirit's movement in your life?

Practice of Charity

John the Baptist calls you to "make straight his paths." What are concrete ways to establish Christ's kingdom of heaven here on earth?

- This week, strive to "think in harmony" with those in your home,

work, and parish. Show hospitality by listening to the opinions of others. Engage in dialogue when problems arise so "that with one accord you may with one voice" arrive at solutions that glorify God.

- Spend this week praying for God's guidance to attend to those in need in your family or community. Investigate outreach programs in your neighborhood and parish. Volunteer in a community soup kitchen or shelter.
- Check on elderly neighbors who may need extra support or companionship. Is there an elderly family member you can comfort with a phone call or visit? Write an email or send a card to let them know they are loved. Invite them for a family meal so they may feel welcome "as Christ welcomed you."

Questions

- The reading from Isaiah foreshadows the arrival of Jesus. The "stump of Jesse" refers to the lineage of King David, of which Jesus will be a part. How do you see the qualities in this passage reflected in Jesus? In what ways is He a green shoot from something that has been chopped down?
- The psalmist provides us with a magnificent depiction of the fullness of justice and peace that comes with God's reign. When you pray this psalm, are you inspired or are you filled with questions about whether such a vision could ever be fulfilled?
- The depiction of John the Baptist is vivid. He is not what we might expect God's powerful messenger to look like. Are there ways in which appearances influence how open you are to receiving God's messages in your life?

Activities

- During dinner, inquire about places in our lives and world where we need to see the promises Isaiah foretells realized. Can we think of where a wolf must learn to lie with a lamb? Cows and bears that should be better neighbors? The local or national newspaper can be a great place to discover these answers, as can our own lives.
- Look at the beginning of the reading from Isaiah and reflect on the gifts of the Spirit he recounts. Can you grow this Advent season in understanding? In knowledge? What actions will you take to do this each day?



Patience and Trust

We might think of patience as trust through time. And our perception of time changes as we grow older. Remember what this time of year felt like when you were a child? It seemed as though Christmas would never get here. Children live so much in the present moment that it's hard to get them to understand the passage of time and the need to wait. As we get older, though, it seems as though time moves faster and faster. We look back on our teenage and young adult years and wonder when we found time to hang out with our friends, to play games (card, board, video—the medium changes but the pastime doesn't). We might think it's our work and family responsibilities, and that's part of it, but even people who have retired say that they find it hard to find time for all that they want to do.

Only at the very end of our lives do we again find time hanging heavy around us. If infirmity and illness keep us from doing the things we love, the days may feel endless and the nights even more so. Instead of having to slow down, we need to remind ourselves that we're in the perfect time and place for long and leisurely conversations with God.






