





On Independence Day Weekend, 1997, a group of students and adults spent their holiday weekend attempting to raise community awareness about environmental concerns and the learning opportunities available along the Youghiogheny River Basin., Those students and their sponsors also raised \$310.52, which they donated to the Regional Trail Corporation for the movement of the Combination Baggage - Passenger Car from its location at Buddtown to its current site along Collinsburg Road in West Newton.

The students coined the phrase "Combination Renovation - Engineering Education." This slogan emphasized the trail group and educational community's plan was to convert the rail car into an Environmental Learning Center. On that 4th of July weekend, a promise was made by members of the Regional Trail Corporation - these students would be present at the ground breaking for the renovation and conversion of the rail car.

Through the efforts of those students and the Regional Trail Corporation, local industry and government became aware of the goals of this effort. Organizations and companies, including Allegheny Energy, The West Newton Lions Club, The West Newton Veterans of Foreign Wars, and General Nutrition made cash contributions to this effort. Frank Marsh, whose father was one of the Station Masters at the original Pittsburgh & Lake Erie Railroad Station, also contributed to the project. Thanks to efforts put forth by Congressman Mascara and his staff, the CSX Corporation laid the rails and bed on which the rail car sits. The Mon Valley Education Consortium organized the local awareness effort which led to student involvement. Local government officials, including State Senator Allen Kukovich, State Representative Ted Harhai, and Congressman Frank Mascara, Penn DOT, DCNR and many others helped in the raising of the funds needed to initiative the project, which we dedicate today by way of this ground breaking ceremony.

Today we keep that promise. We hope that you will share in the enthusiasm which these young people and their fellow students have brought to this project. We seek your assistance and support in the continuation of this program. We need volunteers for a variety of project components. Make a promise today to help, so that your children, your grandchildren and their grandchildren will enjoy what we today have set forth to build.
