Local folks have referred to this area as Smithton Beach for the

past 60 or 70 years.

The Yough Trail Committee of DWNI sponsored the cleanup day in association with PA Cleanways. By noon the 60 volunteers had filled 190 bags with trash and assembled a huge pile of unbagged trash, ranging from TVs and toasters to bed springs and carpeting, said Jack Cusick, a member of the Yough Trail Committee. Cusick said Rostraver Township was to later truck the trash to the Municipal Authority of Westmoreland County's sanitary landfill in Pricedale, where it was to be accepted without charge.

The Yough Trail Committee, working as volunteers with the Regional Trail Corporation, plans to develop the Smithton beach area into a family-type recreation area for fishing and picnicking as well as a stop over rest area for trail users, said Cusick. He said a parking area has been cleared and the property has been posted to restrict motor vehicles from the river-

front area.

In the near future, the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission plans to construct a boat launching ramp for public use. "Persons who wish to use the beach area for fishing and picnicking may do so at their own risk," said Cusick. However, "any persons found littering, dumping trash or disregarding motor vehicle or firearms restrictions will be prosecuted and fined up to \$300."
