For those in the Northern Hemisphere, the countdown to summer and the warm sunrays to release the endorphins with schools nearing their break and a lot more time outdoors.


For those in the Eastern Hemisphere, it's a time to mark the half way to the year.

Wherever you may be, its time to sit back and read, go for a walk, explore the sun, to enjoy the splendours of God's creation and reflect on our blessings.






