SNAP VIEW OF HISTORY 20 YEARS AGO

1943 in India saw the worst Famine in Bengal

For those who remember 1943 saw the worst famine as a result of several failures by the ruling British Colony and leaders. The family was centred in the Bengal region where the death toll ranged from 1 to 3 million people.

Rice fields were destroyed and rice stocks confiscated with fear of Japan invading nearby Burma. This was deemed to be the catalyst for the famine during World War II

It was evident that Winston Churchill, the British Prime Minister at the time of World War II, was prioritizing Britain's war effort and not paying attention to the crisis in India. It wasn't until October 1943 that the British military took over the relief effort in the Bengal region and started the import of barley and wheat.

FAMILY RESEARCH ...

At a recent holiday, I was fortunate to attend a number of 'free' family research seminars conducted by **Brenda Wheeler**, Consultant and Lecturer with the National Institute for Genealogical. It was enlightening to observe and be reassured, that I have adhered to many of the ground rules of family research. Doing family research for Indian records is meant to be getting easier as more records are uploaded online. However, the authentication of these records are still reliant on actual facts of family data.

A common mistake that is known and published in Genealogy are the spellings of surnames. Often surnames are spelt as they sound or in some instances adopted from the region they were born, thereby changing the genealogy record.

- ♦ Family research can become very expensive with the purchase of certificates to validate the family lineage.
- Research is still dependant on family input. Reaching out to elderly family members for their knowledge is just as important.
- ♦ DNA records are now gathering interest with more data matching families.

If there are any Collins connections or history that you could share, I'd be keen to receive these and eventually have a Collins Family History chart to share.
