

What would disaster films be like if the majority of the characters in the movie did not believe in the premise that was about to kill them?




DENIERS

PETER

Gary isn't much better. He loves his daughter but is in complete denial that Erin ever left the house.

The one thing that seems to break through to them is Erin getting on NFN News, their favorite and most trusted news station.





JOHN POODLES

A veteran field reporter for NFN News who will get killed reporting on a "fake" story every single episode.

Because the network denies that the incident has even occurred, a new actor will be hired by the network to play John Poodles each week.

Playing John Poodles is the worst gig in show business.

Peter and Cindy explore the various ways that the game was stolen.




The Cure for Stupid

P members find an ugly dog and are about to slaughter him, until Erin whisks him away.

Cindy breaks free and mauls station owner Gibby Bottoms after he pinches her butt. Roger is forced to kill her. Erin gets promoted.

This told us that we were right on target.


Deniers is a screwball comedy, but with important and frightening undertones.

There will be a show like this soon. We hope it's this one.


