June 11, ADA meeting minutes, Fruitville library

Board members present: Robin, Martha, Roy, Linda and Ulrike

Clinic Kelly Layne, we will get a bio together, look for a facility which will host the clinic and find a date in November

Further discussion about clinics ensued. We do need an action plan for next year! We discussed what the goals of the members could be. We have around 80 to 90 members. The action plan needs to have 3 steps; 1. Survey. 2. Reaching out to clubs around us and 3. calendar of events. Deb Herbert, Suzy Jennings and Linda Roberts offered to gather the questions for a membership survey.

Other ideas were discussed. Do our members really want traditional clinics or something very different like Baroque? There was also the suggestion to do a one-day symposium. This symposium would start at the bottom and should be very educational. For example, three riders in the morning to show specific aspects and then rides in the afternoon. Another idea was a cavaletti clinic. Also, trainers should ask their students what type of show they want as our ride counts were significantly down this past year.

We need to find out how to get more responses for the shows. The only good show lately was in December. The other ones had not enough rides. Maybe we should do only 3 shows next season?

Suzy Jennings will inquire for dates at Triple J and Roy and Jaymie will help. We are still thinking about connecting them with the Featherstone HJ shows in order to make combined shows available...

New show locations were brainstormed. There is a new eventing barn in Myakka which will have a nice sand arena. Maybe it is a future show location??

The county is considering turning (rezoning) open land into land which can be developed...it's right on Fruitville and Verna roads.

Awards Dinner discussion: Robin reported that Geckos will charge an additional \$500 for us to have the dinner there. That will up the costs for all of us. The dressage clinic with Kelly Layne is cancelled

We discussed our next activity the symposium about basic dressage. Deb Herbert, Suzy Jennings, and Karen Abbattista are going to be the Symposium committee. Karen Abbattista will be the clinician and we will probably have it at Robin's or Deb's place. Both are very suitable. It will be very cost-efficient, and we hope for a lot of interest from our members and potential new members. The purpose is to introduce new riders to dressage. It will consist of an Intro B session and a Training level session in the ring and a class section afterwards. We plan 2 basic symposiums, and if there is enough interest, a third one which might be more advanced. The dates will probably be in October, November and December.

Suzy Jennings stated, that we do need more media presence! Deb will look into Instagram for us and we should make our FB page more active!

We discussed how to acquire more riders for our shows... We used to have more western dressage riders and Deb suggested to upgrade our schooling shows to rated shows for Western dressage riders. We would need a higher qualified judge and pay more fees. Overall, we were not able to decide how far we wanted to go for Western dressage.

Possible show schedule: We contacted Triple J and right now there are several openings. We decided to schedule shows on Sunday, October 6th, Sunday, November 17th, Sunday, January 26th, and Sunday, March 15th potentially another one in May. *These dates are tentative, pending confirmation by Triple J.*

Henry will tell SWFDA about our show schedule and Robin will confirm it with Triple J. Suzy will talk to Featherstone about the possibility to combine our shows.

Roy announced that Buff Betz died. She always was a great supporter of our shows! We discussed possible ideas to honor her. Robin suggested a memorial class at our show and we will donate to a possible go fund me fund, if one is established.

Linda suggested to consider changing the cost for our sponsorship ads now that we are halfway through the year. For now, we will leave them and discuss the issue at the annual meeting.

The election for the board members will be announced in the next newsletter. All the positions are open every year. **We** need new board members and fresh ideas!

USDF News and Announcements: Freestyle Changes

USDF Governance Representatives:

During the July USEF Board of Directors (BOD) Meeting the Extraordinary Rule Change Proposal (Tracking ID #042-19) submitted by the US Equestrian Dressage Sport Committee, was discussed. In doing so, the feedback provided by USDF via the USDF Governance Survey along with feedback submitted directly to USEF was considered. The USEF BOD has approved the rule change to DR 129.9, which will go into effect December 1, 2019.

The rule change is as follows:

DR129 Musical Freestyle Ride. Changes to read:

9. Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior, FEI Young Rider and FEI Para-Equestrian Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 63% for Training through Fourth levels and 60% for FEI levels in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a USEF/USDF licensed Dressage Competition, Federation Licensed or FEI recognized Dressage Competition, or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility, or copy of the USDF score verification, must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class.
