Bylaws Change

Club membership voted to approve some bylaws changes. The changes in Article V address the job descriptions of the officers on the board and allow us to distribute the workload and better serve the association. Our bylaws for Article V are now:

Article V

OFFICERS

<u>SECTION 1:</u> The officers of the Association shall be PRESIDENT, VICE PRESIDENT, GENERAL SECRETARY, EVENT COORDINATOR, AND TREASURER/MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY.

<u>SECTION 2:</u> PRESIDENT: The President shall be the Chief Executive Officer of this Association and shall preside at all meetings of the Executive Board and membership. He/she shall see that the By-Laws, rules and regulations of the Association are enforced and shall perform all of the duties that may be prescribed from time to time by the Executive Board and/or the membership.

<u>SECTION 3:</u> VICE PRESIDENT: In the absence of the President, the Vice President shall have the powers and perform the duties of the President and such other duties as may be prescribed by the Executive Board and/or membership. He/she shall be ex officio member of all committees.

<u>SECTION 4:</u> GENERAL SECRETARY: The General Secretary shall keep the minutes of all membership and Executive Board meetings. He/she shall be the custodian for the safekeeping of all documents and records of the Association. He/she shall make a report of his/her office to the Executive Board when requested and to all membership meetings and shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Executive Board. He/she will also oversee the maintenance of the website, publication of the newsletter, and any social media sites.

<u>SECTION 5:</u> EVENT COORDINATOR: The event coordinator shall oversee the events that are hosted by Alpha Dressage Association including, but not limited to, shows, clinics, and demonstrations.

<u>SECTION 6:</u> TREASURER/MEMBERSHIP SECRECTARY: The Treasurer must account for all moneys and shall submit an itemized statement in detail at each meeting of the members and to the Executive Board when requested. He/she will also be responsible for membership records, mailing lists, and handling related correspondence.

RULES AND GUIDELINES

Entries: Entries for competing and non-competing (schooling horses) must include a current Coggins, entry form, liability releases and fees. We now accept on-line entries as well as via standard USPS mail. Once your key paperwork (Coggins, liability releases, etc.) is uploaded, it is there for each show until it expires.

Option 1- Online Entries

Online entries and payment will now be accepted by Equestrian Entries. Follow this link > https://www.equestrianentries.com/login. Sign yourself up to be a new member. You must also sign up your horse and your trainer. If you do not have a trainer, sign yourself up as trainer. Then, look for the show dates and select our ADA schooling show.

Option 2- US Mail:

We still accept entries by USPS mail, so you may send your entry (checks made payable to Alpha Dressage Association) by US mail to **Suzi Jennings**, **21209 69**th **Avenue East, Bradenton**, **FL 34211**. We will not accept any entries that are phoned or e-mailed in. Entries received after the closing date will be accepted at the discretion of the management. There are no refunds of any fees after 5 pm on the Thursday prior to the show.

Fees: Fees are \$30.00 per horse/rider combination, per class, for Alpha Dressage Association and Southwest Florida Dressage Association members. Non-members must pay \$35.00 per horse/rider combination, per class.

There is a \$15.00 office fee per horse/rider combination.

The fee for non-competing (schooling horses) is \$15.

The late fee is \$10 per class.

Alpha Dressage now accepts Venmo as a method of payment for shows, clinics and membership. Venmo User Name @Alpha-Dressage

If your check is returned for non-sufficient funds, you expressly authorize your account to be electronically debited or bank drafted for the amount of the check plus any applicable fees. The use of a check for payment is your acknowledgement and acceptance of this policy and its terms and conditions. Stabling is available: An overnight stall is \$40 and a day only stall is \$30. Stalls will be assigned as completed entries (entry form, liability release, Coggins and payment) are received. Stall assignments will be posted at the show. You must provide your own feed, hay, shavings and water buckets. If your horse will be staying overnight, you must make your own provisions for feeding at night and the next morning.

Schooling: There is no schooling in the show arena on the day of the show. However, schooling is usually available in the show arena on Saturday afternoons after the ring has been set up.

Footing: Covered sand arena $20m \times 60m$ for training level and above tests. The arena will be $20m \times 40m$ for all introductory tests if the number of entries warrant the change.

Approved helmets MUST be worn by all riders while mounted.

Riders under the age of 18 years must be accompanied by an adult while on the show grounds.

Correct tack will be required as defined by USEF – i.e. smooth snaffle bits – no twisted, wire, roller or Pelham bits. Martingales, side reins, draw reins, horse boots and bandages are not allowed. Dressage whip maximum length is 47.2" (120 cm) including the sash.

Hot weather show attire is allowed. This means any color breaches and polo shirts. T-shirts are not allowed. Age appropriate boots are also required.

Ride times will be emailed to each entrant and posted on the ADA website on Thursday prior to the show. Classes will NOT run in order.

Awards: Ribbons through sixth place. A high point award will be presented to the highest scoring rider of the day. Scores will count toward ADA Year-End awards for the current competition year.

Directions to Triple J: From I75, take exit # 210, go east on Fruitville Road for 4.5 miles, turn left onto Sinclair Drive. Triple J will be on the right approximately 2 miles from Fruitville road.

Any topics that are not specifically addressed in the above guidelines or any exceptions to the guidelines must be discussed with and approved by the show manager. Any violation of the show rules can result in your exclusion from this and future ADA events.
