Volunteer Job Descriptions –Scribe by Donna Sloben

Hello everyone. This will be the last article in my Volunteer series. This month we're going to talk about being a scribe.

Being a scribe is an essential job, in fact we can't have a show without one. The scribe keeps the judge and the tests organized as well as making sure both you and the judge have the tools necessary to keep the day running smoothly, so the judge can concentrate on the tests and you as the scribe can focus on getting the scores and comments recorded.

Scribing requires some dressage knowledge and the ability to follow along as the judge calls the scores and the comments. The scribe helps to verify the judge has the correct test in front of them for the horse and rider that is in the arena ready to show, also making sure that the number on the horse matches the number on the test. The scribe needs to be able to accurately record the judges' comments while writing quickly and legibly. Being able to read and understand the comments is vital to the competitor, it can be very frustrating if a rider can't make out a comment. The competitor is there to compete, but also learn what they need to improve so the comments are very important to each rider. There are many abbreviations and symbols that can be used which can be found on the USDF website as well as helpful tips and tricks. Many big shows now use electronic systems, but most schooling shows will be using the handwritten method for a long time to come.

Being a scribe is a challenging but rewarding position. Many people enjoy doing it and learning from it. There are even professional scribes who get paid to travel to national and international competitions and as a result, have the opportunity to go to events like the World Equestrian Games and national championships.

If you think you might be interested in learning to scribe but have never done it before, a schooling show is the perfect place to start. An experienced competitor will most likely be able to jump right in and give it a try, but if you are not that experienced, the best way may be to request that you be able to shadow a scribe to see what is involved and even do a few practice tests.

Most judges will tell you that they prefer to have the same scribe all day or even all weekend at the bigger shows. It is easier if they don't have to explain their process (each judge will have their individual preferences regarding how they like to do things) more than once a day. That being said, we will take scribes for half the day if that is all we can get, but out of respect to the judge, we will usually give preference to someone who can scribe for the entire day.

We are always looking for scribes, as are many other show venues. Last year we ran a scribe workshop and would consider doing it again. As I complete this series, I am reminded that it takes many people to put on a show and keep it running smoothly. It also occurs to me that there is no such thing as a small or unimportant job. Some jobs are easier than others, some require more physical labor, some require attention to detail and a laser focus or the ability to keep riders organized and keep things running on time or even just a good speaking voice, but they are all necessary and important. All of them should require the ability to have a little fun, a sense of humor, an enjoyment of the people and horses we all love, but most of all a willingness to give back to the sport we have embraced! I look forward to seeing you all at the next show. Until then, spend as much time as you can with your beasties, whatever flavor they may be and remember to ENJOY THE JOURNEY!!
