November meeting

In November we welcomed Libby Neily who spoke on her mindful horse program. She is based out of Dragonfly Farm in Saddle Creek. This author was too busy listening to record any notes, but basically mindfulness is the awareness of the present moment. It is a practical skill the utilizes the mind, body, processing emotions, and compassion.

The following two paragraphs were taken from Libby's website (www.dragonflyfarm.com) and give a helpful overview of what she presented.

Why Horses? Simply put, horses are a mirror to ourselves. They allow us to recognize how we are thinking, feeling and acting. Horses, being prey animals, are acutely aware of their surroundings. Their heightened senses offer a unique ability to recognize what a human's *intention* is. In an instant, a horse can scan a person's body language and energy. They are constantly asking the question, "Am I safe with you?" As herd animals, horses seek that safety in others. As we learn to connect with them, we must recognize our emotions and energy. When we make small changes in the way we project, act and feel, the horse gives us instant feedback. This allows us, in real time, to see how the slightest shift in our behavior can change the way we relate to ourselves and those around us.

Why Mindfulness? Mindfulness is the key ingredient when we are learning how to recognize and regulate those emotions. It allows us to become more aware of one's thoughts, emotions and experiences. When you recognize and examine those thoughts and feelings, rather than being overwhelmed, you are better able to manage them rather than avoid them. When working with a horse, you must be in the present moment. They are large, thinking beings that require

your full attention. They react to the slightest change and to notice those reactions, we must be fully present and aware. This is why working with horses can be so helpful in teaching mindfulness techniques!
