## Year End Awards Update

As we are quickly approaching the end of this year's show season, we ask that everyone take a look to see if they have fulfilled their eligibility requirements to be in the running toward year end awards. With two shows left this show season, there is definitely still time for our members to do so! Even though our normal show season runs from December 1 through November 30, this year as a perk for our 50th Anniversary celebration, we will be including the December show in both the 2022 show season as well as the 2023 show season.

Following the December show, you will have until December 10th to be able to submit copies of the first page of your test sheets of your eligible scores to <a href="mailto:alphadressage@gmail.com">alphadressage@gmail.com</a>. Remember, scores are NOT tracked by ADA, your submitted scores will be proof of your scores for the year. You will need 3 scores for Intro through Fourth Levels, or 2 scores for FEI levels to qualify. These scores must be from the same test level, from three different shows with the same horse and rider combination. Any test of the level can be used. The median score of the submitted test scores will be used to calculate your score and the year end award rankings. A median score of at least 58% is required to qualify for an award at any level.


Don't forget, there is also a volunteer requirement of 6 hours! If you volunteer at a show, please make sure that you sign both IN and OUT on the volunteer sheet or else we can not give you credit for your hours. Year end awards will be offered for the highest average score for Junior, Adult Amateur and Open divisions in the following categories:

- Prix Caprilli, Intro, Training, First, Second, Third, Fourth, Freestyle, Pas De Deux, Prix St. Georges, Intermediate I, Intermediate II, FEI Freestyle and Grand Prix.
- WDAA Intro, Basic, Level 1, Level 2, Level 3, Level 4, any level WDAA Freestyle
- Gaited Dressage Intro, Basic, Level 1, Level 2, Level 3, Level 4

## **Dressage Training Customized**

Author: Britta Schöffmann Published 2010 by Trafalgar Square Books



Schöffmann's book discusses training a horse based upon personality traits and physical characteristics including common training mistakes and training tips for each. Woven throughout the book are personal excerpts by riders and trainers: Isabell Werth, Hubertus Schmidt, Monica Theodorescu, George Williams, Jan Brink, Karin Rehbein and Klaus Balkenhol.

Is your horse: Hot? Spooky? Sensitive? Lazy? Schöffmann covers 10 character types and how to approach training various personalities. How is your horse's back, neck and croup built? The author covers why and how specific conformation types need special attention during training. The last sections of the book cover gender differences and the breed characteristics of Warmbloods, Haflingers, Friesians and Andalusians.

Schöffman writes in a very organized, straightforward manner and uses many clear photos throughout. This book is an easy read for a beginner dressage enthusiast or

an enjoyable read for a Pro who enjoys excerpts from fellow trainers discussing their craft.
