Thank you, Volunteers!

I just wanted to say a big Thank You to all the volunteers who helped make this another successful show season! We love putting on these shows, but it does take a village to make it run smoothly! We can't do it without all of you who have given us your time and talents to make it all happen.

Every task is essential to the running of the show, starting with the people who bring the arena over and everyone who helps with setting it up. Without the setup crew it would be very difficult to ride your test! So, here's to the Setup Crew!!

The scribe writes down everything the judge says so that you know what went well, what went not so well and what you might want to work on before your next class or show. Without the scribe, everything would be in the judges' head rather than in your hand. So, here's to the Scribes!!

The runner keeps your tests coming up to the office so they can be scored and is sometimes our point of communication between the judges table and the office. Without the runners, your tests wouldn't get to the office to be scored. So, here's to the Runners!!

The people who work the gate help to keep the show running on time, letting you know when your time is getting close, letting the office know if someone has not shown up or if someone needs help. They are our eyes and ears on the ground. Without them, there would be no point of communication between the riders and the office and you would have to pay close attention to when you need to head over to the arena, rather than focusing on your warm up. So, here's to the People Who Work the Gate!!

The scorers who add up your test scores and work hard to get them out quickly and correctly. Without the scorers, you would have to add up your own scores. So, here's to the Scorers!!

The announcer helps to keep everything running on time and lets us know who's in the arena (let's face it, who doesn't love hearing their name and their equine partner's name announced over the loudspeaker!). The announcer also makes important announcements throughout the day such as High Point winners and my personal favorite, when lunch is available! Without the announcer it would be a very quiet day indeed! So, here's to the announcers!!

The floater and prize person (we really need a better name for this position....maybe the Chief Prize Coordinator), responsible for any number of tasks, the biggest of which is coordinating the ribbons and prizes to be awarded, posting the scores on the bulletin board and putting out the tests, ribbons and prizes for the riders to pick up. Without the floater/prize person, everyone would have to come into the office to collect their tests and ribbons and no one would know how they did in relation to their competitors. So, here's to the Chief Prize Coordinator!!

The Arena Crew on the day of the show. The people who help change the arena during the day and especially the ones who stay to help tear it down and transport it home at the end of the day. Without them, the show staff gets very grumpy and we are no fun to be around because we've all had a very long day! So, here's to the Arena Crew!!

Finally, I'd like to personally thank all the board members who do so much on the front end of a show. Setting the show dates and getting the judges. Setting the show up in Equestrian Entries, taking entries and creating the ride times. Putting together prizes, creating the packets, putting together the judges' box with all the tests (and labels) that will be needed that day, assigning the stalls, arranging for food (very important) and probably 15 other things that I'm forgetting.

So, as you can see, it does truly take a village of people to make it all happen, and so many of you do it while you are also showing on the day! So once again, here's to all of you who give us your time, your talent, your passion and sometimes your sense of humor, to help to make our schooling shows so great, and hopefully you had a little fun and enjoyed being part of it all!

2024 Show Season Forecast

Alpha Dressage Association will be hosting 6 schooling shows this season at Triple J Ranch in Sarasota! In 2023, we were able to host 5 shows and many times had to close shows early due to the amount of interest we received. One thing that sets ADA apart from other schooling shows in the area is the quality of judges we can book. The number of Western Dressage riders who attend ADA shows have been growing over the years. One new element ADA is investigating for the 2024 season is the ability of riders to earn AQHA dressage points for English and western dressage at our shows. Three of the dressage judges for this year are also AQHA judges. We hope this new option for riders in the area draws in some new competitors and horses.

October General Membership Meeting Recap

Dr. Darren Scarafile was our featured speaker at the September 13 meeting. He is in practice with Dr. Kaplan (our August speaker) at Advanced Chiropractic and Physiotherapy in LWR (941-907-9663). He gave a very informative and interesting overview on Functional Medicine and it is clear he is passionate about the benefits it offers patients.

Important points were:

- 1.Stress is an underlying issue with many medical conditions. Understanding the biochemical connection is vital to understand treatment and management.
- 2. The goal of Functional Medicine is to uncover and address the root of health problems and guide in management and/or resolution.
- 3. It is important to understand the interplay of the sympathetic and parasympathetic nervous systems and the gut/brain relationship.
- 4. Laboratory testing is vastly more in depth than the traditional approach.
- 5. Functional medicine addresses health from many angles (example: DNA testing, cortisol and other hormonal levels, etc.) but ultimate intervention includes nutritional and lifestyle interventions.

Functional medicine is a long term investment in your health and it is never too late to get started!

Upcoming USEF Rules Changes

<u>Beginning December 1, 2025</u>, under GR 1101.1, all horses competing in USEF-licensed or -endorsed competitions must be microchipped with a 15-digit ISO compliant 11784/11785 chip.
