SATURDAY SCHOOLING OPTION includes schooling Saturday afternoon with stall overnight through to end of show on Sunday. **No arrival before noon and must be off horse by 5pm.** Available only on advance payment of \$125 on Entry. Time limits will be strictly enforced.

ENTRIES PROCESS:

Entries for this show must be submitted online through the JotForm link on our website. The **Entry Form Link** is found on our website **AlphaDressage.org** under the **Shows** tab. Click on **Entry Form** to access the Entry Form and submit your documents. You must upload proof of current negative Coggins test (within 1 year of show date), proof of vaccinations for Equine Influenza Virus and Rhinopneumonitis (within 6 months of show date), and two liability forms (one for Alpha Dressage and one for Fox Lea Farms). Payment must be made: 1) via Venmo (our Venmo User Name is @Alpha-Dressage), OR 2) by check made payable to Alpha Dressage Assoc. and mailed to: Martha Koehnlein, 490 Percheron Circle, Nokomis, FL 34275. **No refunds for any reason after closing date.**

All competing and non-competing horses must be entered and submit required documents. All riders and trainers that will be schooling/warming up horses and/or present in the schooling area must submit an ADA liability form and a Fox Lea Farm liability form prior to arrival. Forms can be found on our website **AlphaDressage.org** under the **Shows** tab.

Ride times will be emailed and posted on the ADA website on Friday before the show. Classes will NOT run in order.

Fees: Member of ADA and SWFDA – \$35 per class
Non-members – \$45 per class
Noncompeting Horse – \$30 per horse for Members, \$40 per horse for Nonmembers
Office Fee – \$25 per Entry (horse/rider combination)
Day Stalls – Available for \$50.00 per stall. Please reserve and pay for stalls on your Entry.
RV Hookup – No hook-ups available
Haul-in Fee – No charge.
Saturday Schooling Option – Schooling available Saturday afternoon, Sept. 26, includes stall overnight through end of show on Sunday. **No arrival before noon and must be off horse by 5pm** - \$125 in advance on your Entry

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Schooling: No schooling allowed prior to show date unless **Saturday Schooling Option is entered and paid for on Entry**. No schooling in the show arena on the day of the show. Hand walking in show arena is permitted before the start of show and during the lunch break.

Arena: Show arena and warmup arena footing is sand with screenings.

Hot weather show attire is allowed. This means any color breeches and polo shirts are allowed. T-shirts are not allowed. Age-appropriate boots are also required. Coats are not required.

Awards: JR/AA/Open divisions will be placed separately. Ribbons through sixth place. If you are a current member, scores will count toward ADA Year-End awards for the current competition year.

High Point Awards: Potential for six high point awards to the highest scoring rider of the day in the following Divisions when **3 or more horse/rider combinations in the same division enter and show:**

Junior Classical	AA Classical	Open Classical
Junior WDAA	AA WDAA	Open WDAA

High Point calculations exclude scores on Freestyles & USEA tests

RULES AND GUIDELINES ADA will enforce the following:

- Protective Headgear Rule:** Anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must be immediately prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.
- Riders under the age of 18 years must be accompanied by an adult while on the show grounds.
- All riders must have completed all release forms before mounting a horse, whether competing or not. (This also applies to a trainer schooling a client horse and non-competing riders.)
- Bridle numbers must be on the horse when mounted.
- Maximum of three rides per horse/rider combination and maximum of three classes per horse.
- USEF, USDF and WDAA rules on tack and equipment will be enforced. For example: No twisted, wire, roller or Pelham bits. Martingales, side reins, draw reins, horse boots and bandages are not allowed. Dressage whip maximum length is 47.2" (120 cm) including the lash.
- Dogs must be leashed and in the presence of an adult at all times.** Owner must clean up after dog.
- Any topics that are not specifically addressed in the above guidelines or any exceptions to the guidelines must be discussed with and approved by the show manager in advance. Any violation of the show rules can result in your exclusion from this and future ADA events.
