

The map above showing sport finals locations is based on current plans for the 2027 World University Games and is subject to change. A Games in the Triangle is projected to require over 50 different venues for competition and practice, and to involve all 10 colleges and universities across the region. Participants would be housed in Athlete Villages at NC State University and UNC Chapel Hill.
