- 2. Think outside the box: To think in a creative or different way instead of following the usual ideas or methods.
- **3. The bottom line:** The most important point or the final result, often related to finances or decisions.
- 4. Hit a home run: Achieve great success or a great result
- 5. Seal the deal: Finalize an agreement
- 6. Call it a day: To stop working for the day or to decide to finish something.
