



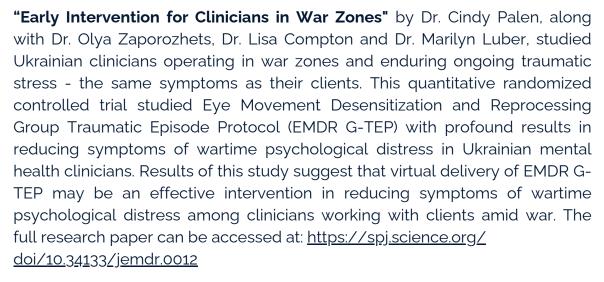

International Mental Health Consulting, Inc. team publishes two important research studies on EMDR & Ukrainian Clinicians in War

Alexandria, VA - Two new research papers by International Mental Health Consulting, Inc. [IMHC] team members, Dr. Cindy Palen and Dr. Amber Quaranta-Leech have been recently published in the *Journal of EMDR Practice and Research*.



There is a need to understand ways to reduce traumatic stress impact on those who live and work in ongoing stress environments. "Randomized Controlled Trial on the Provision of the EMDR-IGTP-OTS-R for Reduction of Posttraumatic Stress Disorder Symptomology with Mental Health Professionals in Ukraine during the War" by Dr. Amber Quaranta-Leech,

along with Dr. Olya Zaporozhets, Dr. Ignacio Jarero, and Dr. Daniel Holland, shows through a randomized controlled trial how this specific EMDR protocol can have positive and lasting results for our colleagues living in a nation at war. Results of this study show the EMDR-IGTP-OTS-R protocol as a beneficial treatment for the reduction of PTSD symptomology in those who are living and working in an ongoing war-related traumatic stress situation. Dr. Oksana Syvak, Co-Founder & Director UIT <u>uatraumatherapy@</u> <u>gmail.com</u> +38 (097) 750-22-57 http://uit.org.ua In addition to this new research showing the efficacy of EMDR during war and not just after the fact, IMHC's partner organization **Ukraine Institute of Traumatherapy** is part of an international collaboration: **VR-Ukraine**. This project was launched on April 30, 2025, with the support of the UPF program of the Government of the Netherlands.

On 1-4 September 2025, an international team led Ukrainian doctors, psychologists, and rehabilitation specialists through the first trainings on state-of-the-art VR solutions in Uzhhorod, Kyiv, and Cherkasy. In the coming months, the program will expand to other regions of the country, and bring together Ukrainian specialists from eight hospitals. It is expected to run until 2028. 33 psychologists have already begun training and will receive highly specialized psychotherapeutic education in evidence-based methods, including EMDR, one of the most effective approaches in working with trauma.

The goal is to implement innovative VR methods to support people with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and provide physical rehabilitation for patients with injuries. The focus of the project, however, is not technology but people. VR therapy (VRET/EMDR-VR) is an evidence-based method that enables safe processing of traumatic experiences, reduces PTSD symptoms, and complements traditional therapy, making it deeper and more accessible.

"For us at UIT, this project is not just an innovation. It is a chance to provide real help to people who have experienced incredible trials. This is the first step of a pilot program that can become the basis for the large-scale implementation of VR therapy throughout Ukraine," says **Dr. Oksana Syvak, MD, Co-Founder & Director** of the **Ukraine Institute of Traumatherapy**.
