#### **CAMPAIGN UPDATE:**

 $\square$  We have our zoning permit for building a medical facility!  $\square$ 

Dr. OZ and our team in Kyiv did a fantastic job navigating the land use zoning process from private/residential to public use to medical.

On March 6, we celebrated Olya's birthday - and her birthday wish came true! We are overwhelmed with gratitude at the outpouring of support for our Let's Light Up UIT for Olya's Birthday! Fundraising Campaign. The request was simple - we needed \$2,500 to connect our electrical box to electricity, the next step in our pre-build punch list.

To date, we have raised \$3,200 with 41 people participating!



The funds over \$2,500 will still go to the Pre-Build funding needs of \$42,000. We still need to raise \$37,598.50 to finish paying our Pre-Build phase bills.

On March 12, we posted a short video update to our **YouTube** and social media channels with pictures of Olya's recent meeting with our architectural team and photos of the electrical box on our property being connected to electricity!

March 28-29, Olya attended the American Counseling Association [ACA] conference in Florida along with two of our team members, Emily & Kelsea who presented their preliminary research for the case study "Impacts on Ukrainian Translators Working In Transnational Supervision During Wartime" work done with our own translators in Ukraine.

Also on March 12, Dr. Oksana Syvak was a speaker at the Ukraine "National Consultations on the Law On the Mental Health Care System" forum, where she convened with other experts and stakeholders to discuss two key documents regarding the creation of the [Ukraine] National Commission on Mental Health Issues; and the certification of mental health professionals. She says "it is just the first step, it opens a possibility to make real changes and reforms, we have a lot to do ahead."

#### **TEAM SPOTLIGHT:**

IMHC is a Virginia-based non-profit with staff and volunteers around the world. We are excited to use this newsletter to introduce our amazing, dedicated team!

This month, it's our co-founder and all around Swiss Army Knife: **Dr. Oksana Syvak** 



Dr. Oksana Syvak is an ob-gyn, mental health professional, teacher, administrator, co-founder, moral compass keeping us all on track and performing at a high level, and so much more. Her heart and current focus is serving the mental health needs of Ukrainian women - veterans, wounded soldiers in rehabilitation, and building up the Project Athena program to assist women veterans, widows and family members with innovative trauma therapy and counseling services.

She graduated with the Doctor of Medicine degree from the Bogomolets National Medical University, Kyiv, Ukraine. She worked as an obstetrician-gynecologist for 18 years, and also served as a Clinical Operation Lead conducting research at Paraxel International. During the Revolution of Dignity at Maidan, she effectively organized four underground medical hospitals for protestors, allowing for the treatment of over 500 patients.

Dr. Syvak went on to apply her skills in the public sector, serving as the Adviser to the Minister of Health of Ukraine and then, as the Deputy Minister of Health on European Integration in 2016 - 2017. She then served as adviser to the Minister of Veterans Affairs, and as Deputy Minister for Veterans Affairs for European Integration, where she supervised the direction of physical and mental health of veterans and their families. She oversaw the launch of the physical rehabilitation system in Ukraine and is the co-author of the Law of Ukraine "On rehabilitation in the field of health care".

Dr. Syvak is the Director of the International Institute of Postgraduate Education and the Director of the Center of Psychological Counseling and Traumatherapy "Open Doors" which is currently providing the clinical care that will become UIT. She also co-founded, along with Dr. Olya Zaporozhets, the Association for Psychological Counseling & Trauma Therapy – Ukraine [APCTT] in 2020. The APCTT is dedicated to providing quality mental health services and training future mental health professionals in the use of advanced approaches and standards of trauma therapy. On February 17, 2025 she received the prestigious award - *The Medal of Saint Panteleimon*, the Great Martyr and Healer. The award was granted for her dedication, tireless work, and service to people of Ukraine. This high recognition is not just an award but a symbol of gratitude for her contribution to preserving the lives and health of Ukrainians. Oksana is a true example of strength, compassion, and selflessness. The Order of Saint Panteleimon is the highest-ranked public award for professionalism and charity presented for significant results in the field of health care, spiritual and physical development of Ukrainian society, established in 2009.

Dr. Syvak lives in Kyiv, Ukraine and her husband is the current Ukrainian Ambassador to Botswana. They have a son and daughter. In her spare time, Oksana loves to travel and take walks. We are so grateful to have Dr. Oksana on our team! Please keep her and her family in your thoughts and prayers.  $\Box$
