

THE FLORIDA SKUNK APE

The Skunk Ape of Florida is a lot like the West Coast's Bigfoot. Tales of it go back decades, to the pioneer days and even to Native American legends. In every story, the ape is described as a hairy monster that has the body of a large ape, but the face of a human.

The Skunk Ape is said to be about 7 or 8 feet tall, with shaggy, dark hair, and a strong odor. One of the most famous encounters happened to a woman changing her tire on a deserted, dark road.
