Glen Mathias Memorial Scholarship Program

1. The three winners of the nightly drawing will nominate a school to qualify for the Fair Scholarship.
2. At the fair board annual meeting, we will have a drawing of the schools that were nominated.
3. Two schools will be drawn to receive a \$500 scholarship each.
4. Kirby Foods, McDonalds, Luehrs Ideal Rides, and Fair Board will present scholarship to winning schools.
5. In March or April of 2027, students from winning schools will submit applications for this scholarship.
6. Application will include writing a 200-word essay on "Why is Agriculture Important to Effingham County". Judging will also be based on school activities and fair involvement.
7. Scholarship is then awarded to selected student at a time selected by the school.

CAMPING NOTICE

- Campers will need to pay upon entry to the fairgrounds.
- Camping Form will be given to campers on arrival by camping attendant or camping form can be found on the fair website www.effinghamcountyfair.com
- The following information is needed to complete the form: name, address, phone number, dates camping, electric box number, and camper license plate number.
- Return completed form with camping payment to the Effingham County Fair attendant on-duty the day of entry.
- Payment for camping may be made with cash or check payable to the Effingham County Fair.
- **Wednesday, prior to the start of the Effingham County Fair**, campers can enter 4-H campgrounds **at or after 8:00 a.m.** to park.
- **Camping costs thirty dollars per day or a maximum amount of \$240.00.** This amount is only for campers that arrive the Wednesday, prior to the start of the Effingham County Fair, at or after 8:00 a.m.
- **Campers that arrive BEFORE Wednesday, prior to the start of the Effingham County Fair**, will pay an early arrival fee of thirty dollars per day in addition to the maximum amount of \$240.00.
- Gray water must be dumped at the dump station and is no longer allowed to run onto the ground or ditches due to State Regulations.
- Utility Trailers are not allowed in the camping area and must be parked in the south lot **against the fence.**
- No campfires are allowed.

Reserved camping spots (only by the track) are available for \$35 per night.

NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS

All exhibitor index, premium reports, judge's sheets, and checks will be computerized. Entry blanks must be filled out completely with name, address, social security number, and premium number.

1. No drinking allowed on fairgrounds.
2. Gambling and gambling devices are absolutely prohibited on fairgrounds.
3. The Effingham County Fair Association will not be responsible for the loss, damage, or injury of any personal property or for any personal injury.
4. The Directors of the Effingham County Fair Association expressly reserve the right to cancel the Fair and to withdraw premiums.
5. The Effingham County Fair Association reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and to arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, protests, and differences in regard hereto and to add to or amend these rules as they may deem advisable.
6. Gates open for admission at 8:00 a.m. each day of the fair. The Fairgrounds will be closed at midnight each night of the fair.
 - A. See Inside Cover for Entry Times
 - B. Livestock: See under your correct section.
7. Persons and/or vehicles entering the Fairground premises do so only with the permission of the Effingham County Fair Association and said Association expressly reserves the right to revoke the license of any person and/or vehicle from entrance and/or access to the Fairgrounds at any time.
8. Rules for entries in all classes:
 - A. Visit www.effinghamcountyfair.com for the Illinois Department of Agriculture Bureau of Animal Health and Welfare 2025 Exhibition Livestock Health Requirements.
 - B. All entries will be computerized. Social Security Number must accompany entries.
 - C. Registration papers will be randomly checked on first place animals.
 - D. Send fees and entries to Effingham County Fair Entries, P.O. Box 212, Altamont, IL 62411. Exhibitors' cards may be picked up at the fair office. They will not be sent out.
 - E. **ABSOLUTELY NO ANIMALS WILL BE RELEASED UNTIL THE GIVEN TIME. THOSE VIOLATING THE RELEASE TIME WILL SUFFER LOSS OF THEIR PREMIUMS WON. VIOLATORS NAMES WILL BE SUBMITTED TO THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE BUREAU OF COUNTY FAIRS FOR FURTHER ACTION.**
 - F. All entries must be made in the name of the owners.
 - G. One item can be entered in only two (2) categories – except where noted.
 - H. No exhibitor will be paid more than two (2) premiums in any one class.
 - I. All protests must be in writing, accompanied by an affidavit setting the grounds for protesting. Protests against exhibition of either animal or article must be filed with the Secretary on day of contest. In every case of protest, the parties protesting must deposit, with the Secretary, a sum of money equal to the amount of the purse. If the protest is sustained, the deposit of money shall be returned to the complainant, but if the protest is not allowed, the said deposit of money shall be forfeited to the Board and the purse shall be paid to the winner.
 - J. Refer to rules, by Department, for other entries.
 - K. All livestock exhibitors must purchase exhibitors' ticket (except Class H entries).
9. If any of these rules are prohibited by the laws of this state or held invalid in any state or in the United States, such rule or rules shall be ineffective to the extent of such prohibition of invalidity, without invalidating the remaining provisions hereof; it being the intention of the parties that these rules shall comply with the State of Illinois.
 - No Glass Bottles Allowed on Grounds.
 - Dogs must be kept away from food areas and must be on a leash.
 - No Bikes, Rollerblades, Skates, Skateboards, Golf Carts, Side by Sides (Except Authorized Personnel), and Hoverboards.

Fitting Rule: Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation. The use of false tail heads is prohibited. The addition of hair, hemp, or any similar substance to any part of an animal is prohibited. This rule applies to both breeding stock and steers. No entry fee in championship classes. No more than two premiums will be paid to any exhibitor under any one premium number. See State regulations for health requirements governing exhibits in this class. **Registration papers will be randomly checked on first place animals.** All Jr. Show and 4-H Members wishing to participate in open shows **MUST** pay applicable stall rent.

A liability waiver must be signed by a parent or legal guardian before an exhibitor may compete. Waivers will be available at check-in. Any animal exhibited must be owned or leased by the exhibitor. An animal may be jointly owned by members of the exhibitor's immediate family. In the case of illness or death of the animal a substitute will be permitted upon approval of the superintendent. Each animal must be entered and shown by only one exhibitor. Each animal may show only once in each class. Each animal shown must be two years old by May 1, current year. No stallions or jacks are allowed. All entries must be in the proper class, or they will be disqualified.

Junior Division: 8 to 13 years old as of September 1st **Senior Division:** 14 years old as of September 1st

An exhibitor may show up to two animals per show. Example: 2 ponies, 2 horses, or 2 mules or a combination of horse, pony, or mule. See Horse entry form for a list of two animal classes. An exhibitor may enter 2 same sex animals in the appropriate halter classes. Another exhibitor may show the second animal.

Dress requirements are as follows: **HALTER AND PERFORMANCE EVENTS:** Western style long pants, western style long sleeved shirt, western hat, western boots with a heel. A coat, vest, jacket, gloves, chaps, and spurs are optional. Chaps and spurs are prohibited in halter and showmanship classes. **Approved riding helmet required for all Exhibitors in all mounted classes.** **SPEED EVENTS:** Long pants, collared short sleeved shirt (no sleeveless or T-shirts will be allowed), and western boots with a heel. No hats or caps may be worn. All rules and patterns will be posted the day of the show.

Assigned exhibitor numbers must be displayed appropriately in every class.

An exhibitor's carriage of free hand is optional. However, it may not touch tack or the animal in pleasure classes.

Bits must be appropriate for age of animal. Animals age 5 and under may be shown in a hackamore or snaffle. Animals 6 years or older must be shown in a bit (with shanks) in all performance classes.

All exhibitors must display sportsmanship throughout the show. Cruelty to or rough handling of an animal will result in disqualification. This includes whipping or hitting in front of the saddle.

For safety purposes: horses will be required to walk into and out of the arena. Any exhibitor running through the gate will be automatically disqualified. Once inside the arena, the horse and rider may circle once before beginning a run.

Exhibitor number must be worn on the backside of exhibitor or attached to each side of the saddle pad or tack. Except for in-hand classes one number shall be worn on the exhibitor's back.

Superintendents may dismiss any horse and/or exhibitor that they deem too dangerous.

State Law for all equine participating in an advertised event requires a current negative Coggins test.

Since Illinois is a Bovine Tuberculosis Accredited-Free State, this means that Illinois cattle may be exhibited in Illinois shows without tuberculin tests. No tuberculin test is required for steers and females in market classes provided that they are not co-mingled with breeding animals being exhibited.

What to Expect for Sellers at the Effingham County Youth Livestock Auction

Afternoon

4-H members wash and prepare their animal for the auction ring

Cleanup/Setup @3:00 pm

Meeting @ 4:00pm

4-H members and parents gather at arena for quick informational meeting about auction

Members will also help set up chairs in the arena and get picture taken

During the auction

4-H members stay in vicinity of auction; as assigned sale order draws near, have the animal ready to take into the ring.

Swine sell in the south ring, other animals sell in north ring, alternating back and forth.

When each member's animal is sold, a picture will be taken with the buyer. At this time, the seller should ask the buyer where the animal is going (which locker, to market, etc).

After the Auction

If the seller's animal is headed to a locker/market, seller should stick around after the auction and help load animals onto the trailers of the various lockers.

If the seller's animal is not headed to a locker that is picking up animals, seller needs to make arrangements with the buyer for the seller to deliver the animal to the buyer.

Species-Specific Notes

SWINE

During the auction, swine will be moved to the swine wash racks in selling order to be washed immediately before moving to the auction ring; older members will assist in moving animals to and from wash racks and auction ring.

Swine will be marked on their backs as they exit the auction ring with the color of paint that corresponds with the locker they are to be delivered to. Animals to be shown at State Fair will not be marked.

MEAT PEN RABBITS

Sellers will bring animals into the ring in cage furnished by seller.

MEAT PEN CHICKENS

Sellers will bring animals into the ring in cage furnished by seller.

PLEASE NOTE:

It is the SELLER's responsibility to arrange transport of the animal to the buyer. As a courtesy, many local lockers bring a trailer the night of the auction and will haul the animals headed to their facility.

For animals not going to lockers (such as meat pen chickens) it is still the seller's responsibility to arrange delivery to the buyer.
