

Meet our Vice President: A Leading Voice

As we gear up for our Spring concert, we're taking a moment to highlight a member who turns our choir's dreams into destinations: our Vice President, Mike Stanton.

With a lifelong love of music and a career rooted in education, Mike brings heart, harmony, and vision to the chorus. He's more than a guiding voice—he's a steady force helping shape the future of the group, one rehearsal (and one sectional) at a time.



When Mike Stanton joined the Albuquerque Civic Chorus two years ago, the tenor and bass sections were small—just a handful of voices as Mike recalls. What began as a return to the world of music quickly grew into a deep commitment to our chorus as a member and as a leader.

Mike's musical roots run deep. Raised in Albuquerque, he performed in musical theater and show choirs throughout his youth, gracing the stage at Popejoy Hall in productions like *The Sound of Music* and *Fiddler on the Roof*. After college, music took a backseat to life and career, but the passion never went away. Following his retirement from a long, accomplished career in education—most recently at UNM Health Sciences—Mike returned to his first love: singing.

Since rejoining the world of choral music, Mike has become one of the chorus's most dedicated and enthusiastic leaders. As Vice President of the Albuquerque Civic Chorus, he approaches his role with a blend of heart and experience. With a background in teaching, special education, and adult learning, Mike demonstrates how choral singing can foster both individual growth and social connection. For Mike, it's not just about singing well—it's about building a space where people can connect, challenge themselves, and be proud of what they create together.

CAPOL'S CHORAL CORNER

These selections offer a rich and diverse musical experience, celebrating everything from the power of choral music in global unity to the beauty of love, fantasy, and discovery.

Each piece reflects a unique perspective on the human experience, and together they form a captivating journey through some of the most beloved and timeless works in choral music.

The Secret Garden

With music by Lucy Simon and a book and lyrics by Marsha Norman, The Secret Garden is a moving, tender story about healing, transformation, and the ever-prevailing power of love.

Set in 1910 England, the musical tells the story of Mary Lennox, a lonely and spoiled girl who is sent to live with her reclusive uncle in a mansion surrounded by an overgrown garden. As Mary discovers the magic of the secret garden, she begins to unlock the hearts of those around her, bringing life and light back into their world.

The choral selections from The Secret Garden include some of the show's most poignant and uplifting songs, such as The Girl I Mean to Be and Wick. These songs showcase the beauty of the score, which blends elements of classical, folk, and musical theater styles. Brigadoon

The Music Man

The Music Man, by Meredith Willson, is a quintessential American musical that captures the charm and spirit of small-town life. Set in the early 20th century, the musical tells the story of a con artist, Harold Hill, who poses as a music professor to swindle a town into buying musical instruments and uniforms for a boys' band that he never intends to form. However, through the power of music, Hill's plans begin to unravel as he falls in love with the town librarian, Marian Paroo.

In this choral selection, you'll hear some of the show's most iconic songs, including Goodnight, My Someone;

Good Night Ladies; Till There Was You; and Seventy-Six Trombones

These pieces are characterized by their energetic, brass-heavy orchestrations and singable melodies, making *The Music Man* a beloved classic. The choral arrangements bring the same vibrancy and charm to the stage, celebrating the power of music to bring people together.

Baba Yetu: The Lord's Prayer

Composed by Christopher Tin, Baba Yetu is a powerful and uplifting choral work that gained international acclaim after it was featured as the theme song for the video game Civilization IV.

The piece is set to the Swahili text of the Lord's Prayer, and its energetic rhythms, soaring melodies, and lush harmonies evoke a sense of global unity and spirituality. The work's blend of traditional African choral styles with orchestral elements makes it an inspiring piece, showing humanity as interconnected.

Sogno di Volare

Another masterpiece by Christopher Tin, Sogno di Volare (The Dream of Flight) was composed as the theme for the video game Civilization VI. With its sweeping orchestral opening and soaring choral parts, this work expresses the human longing for discovery and the eternal pursuit of knowledge.

Sung in Italian, the lyrics depict humanity's dream of exploring the skies and beyond, celebrating the spirit of adventure, progress, and the quest for a better future. This choral piece beautifully blends classical and modern elements to create a rich and inspiring experience.

One of the ways Mike enriches the chorus community is by regularly hosting tenor and bass sectionals at his home. What began as a small gesture—a few singers gathered to nail down the harmonies—has evolved into a welcoming tradition that draws nearly the entire lower voice section. These gatherings offer a chance to strengthen not just the sound, but the bonds between members.

Mike also puts his technical skills to work by bringing his own equipment to rehearsal, recording the fullness of our chorus for us to hear. We are able to review the sound, identify areas for improvement, and share helpful insights with the group. In doing this, we are empowered to make music that we are excited to share with the world.

Mike invests his time and energy in helping the chorus grow—musically, structurally, and socially. He sees a bright future for the group. He envisions collaborations, travel, and a wider reach, actively working to lay the foundation for that growth.

When asked what advice he would give to new and current members, he encouraged others to fully engage with the chorus, to get to know their section, to practice outside of rehearsal, and to view their involvement not just as a hobby, but as a source of fulfillment. Each rehearsal is a voice lesson, a time to invest into our sound and ourselves.

In a chorus that values harmony in every sense of the word, we thank Mike Stanton for his voice that rings out, and his presence that steadies our sound.
