Randy Travis once sang, "And I hear tell, the road to hell is paved with good intentions." I get what he's saying. Good intentions that remain only that, good intentions, aren't worth much.

Over the years, as I have officiated at the confirmations of young and old, the word "intend" in the Rite of Confirmation has caught my eye more and more.

For instance, on Sunday, May 5, as at every confirmation, the confirmands will be asked, "Do you *intend* to hear the Word of God and receive the Lord's Supper faithfully?"

Again, they will be asked, "Do you intend to live according to the Word of God, and in faith, word, and deed to remain true to God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, even to death?"

One last time they will be asked, "Do you *intend* to continue steadfast in this confession and Church and to suffer all, even death, rather than fall away from it?"

Of course the printed answer, the correct answer to those questions is, "I do, by the grace of God." If any youth or adult does NOT intend to hear the Word of God and receive the Lord's Supper faithfully, then he or she shouldn't be confirmed! They shouldn't even be standing before God's altar and in front of the congregation fielding the question.

If any youth or adult does NOT intend to live according to the Word of God and remain true to God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and yet answers, "I do, by the grace of God," then he has just told his first lie and spoken his first denial as he begins his lifelong journey away from God and away from His Word.

If any youth or adult does NOT intend to continue steadfast in the Church and her confession of the faith, even unto death, then he or she should just excuse themselves and politely exit the Church.

But most confirmands DO intend to hear God's Word and receive His Supper faithfully. Most confirmands DO intend to remain true to God and live according to His Word. Most confirmands DO intend to continue in the Church and her confession of the faith—even if they must die doing it.

That doesn't mean they necessarily will, but it does mean that they intend to. So how can the good intentions expressed in the Confirmation Rite be turned into lived realities.

No confirmand has the strength to make good on his good intentions—not all by himself. We sinners are too weak. The devil, the world, and our sinful flesh are too strong.

Jesus says, "Apart from me you can do nothing." Apart from Jesus, we end up like withered branches that are gathered and thrown on the burn pile we call hell.

That's why we pray for our confirmands. That's why they pray for themselves. That's why Jesus intercedes for them. So that they may be strong in the Lord and in the strength of His might.

Forgiven and fed, sanctified and strengthened by the Lord's Word and Supper they will make good on their good intentions. So can you! With Jesus and the help of His Spirit all of us who are confirmed will remain true to the Triune God in whose name we were baptized and walk in the newness of life to which we were raised at the font. We will continue steadfast in this Confession and Church right up to our last breath. Then the good intentions of our Confirmation, instead of paving the road to hell, will, by God's grace and help, pave the road to heaven.

# More Than a Negative

Even if you've never had to testify in court, a thousand TV shows have made you familiar with the question, "Do you swear to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?" Why not just make people swear to tell the truth? Or make them promise not to lie?

Any parent who has ever had to interrogate a child about a broken cookie jar or a scuffle over a toy knows the answer. There are plenty of ways to try to get out of trouble without *technically* lying. You tell *just enough* of the truth to skate on by.

We often play the game of seeing *how close* we can get to sinning without *technically* going over the line.

But in our heart of hearts we know that this is not what God intended when He gave us the commandments. He's not giving us a merely negative rule and challenging us to just barely stay away from this or that. There is much more to each commandment than a prohibition. We shouldn't just avoid murdering people — we should be of service to our neighbor.

For each negative prohibition in the commandments there is a positive good that we are to cherish and protect. In the Eighth Commandment, that gift is the reputation of our neighbor and our relationship with him:

You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

*What does this mean*? We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.

Your relationship with your family members (who are your nearest neighbors), the other members of your congregation, your coworkers and your friends is one of the most precious gifts you have been given. You need to exercise good stewardship with this gift just as much as you need to exercise good stewardship with your life, resources, time and income. This is an especially fragile gift because it's easy to ruin a relationship with slander and talking behind someone's back.

But speaking well of your neighbor in Christian love is absolutely free; it costs you nothing, yet it pays you great dividends. If you find this challenging at times, if you are tempted to speak ill of others, just remember that this other person is also a beloved child of God for whom your Lord Jesus suffered and died. Your Lord Jesus loves you both.
