I like free! Many years ago, my voungest son, Aidan, and were at Champaign. Marketplace We Mall in happened to be in the food court. A young woman was standing in front of one of the Asian restaurants with a tray in her hands. On that tray were chunks of teriyaki chicken impaled on toothpicks. Best of all, they were free for the taking.

I don't know how many passes Aidan and I shamelessly made by that tray loaded with teriyaki chicken, but it was more than one.

In the summertime, I like to get out to the parks and check the wood lines for black raspberries and blackberries. There is nothing better than to see that pop of color signaling that the berries are ripe. God has put them there, free for the taking. Some go in a plastic container; others find their way into my mouth.

I like free! But during the Democrat convention, on August 19 and 20, I didn't like free, not at all. Planned Parenthood had parked a mobile clinic near the United Center, the site of the convention. For two days they offered free medication abortions and free vasectomies. FREE!

At no cost, women could acquire the medications that would end the lives of their preborn children—not to mention endanger their own lives. At no cost to them, men could take the necessary steps ("snip, snip") to prevent them from fathering children.

With sin came death. Death is a sin thing. Death is a devil thing—the devil who has been a murderer from the beginning. Death is not a God thing. Free abortions and free vasectomies incur a great cost to those who partake of them—the cost of human lives, of wounded consciences and tormented souls.

We must work with God to defend and nurture life. We must oppose those who peddle death or give it away for free.

To those who have forfeited the lives of their children, for those whose consciences are wounded and whose souls are tormented by their sin, Jesus has something to give them. He gives it at the font where His Word causes plain water to become the lifegiving waters of Holy Baptism. He gives it in His Supper where Jesus, who is the Life, feeds us with the very body and blood that He gave and shed for our forgiveness. Free for the taking. Free for you. I like free!

SCHOOL MUSINGS


- -Trinity Lutheran School was pleased to welcome 45 students to their first day of school on Friday, August 16!
